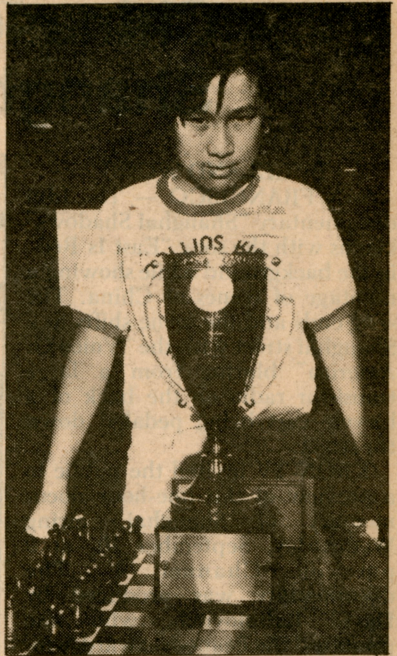
Kenny Fong Returns from Iceland

To *East/West*:

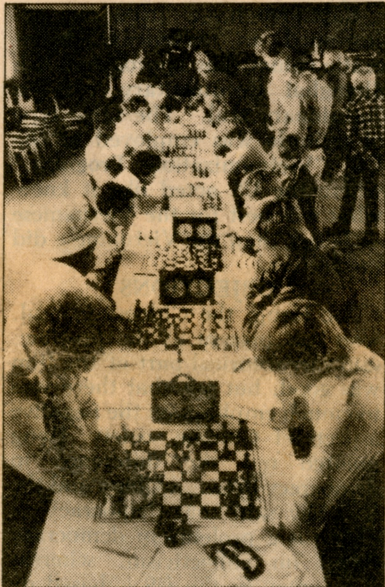
