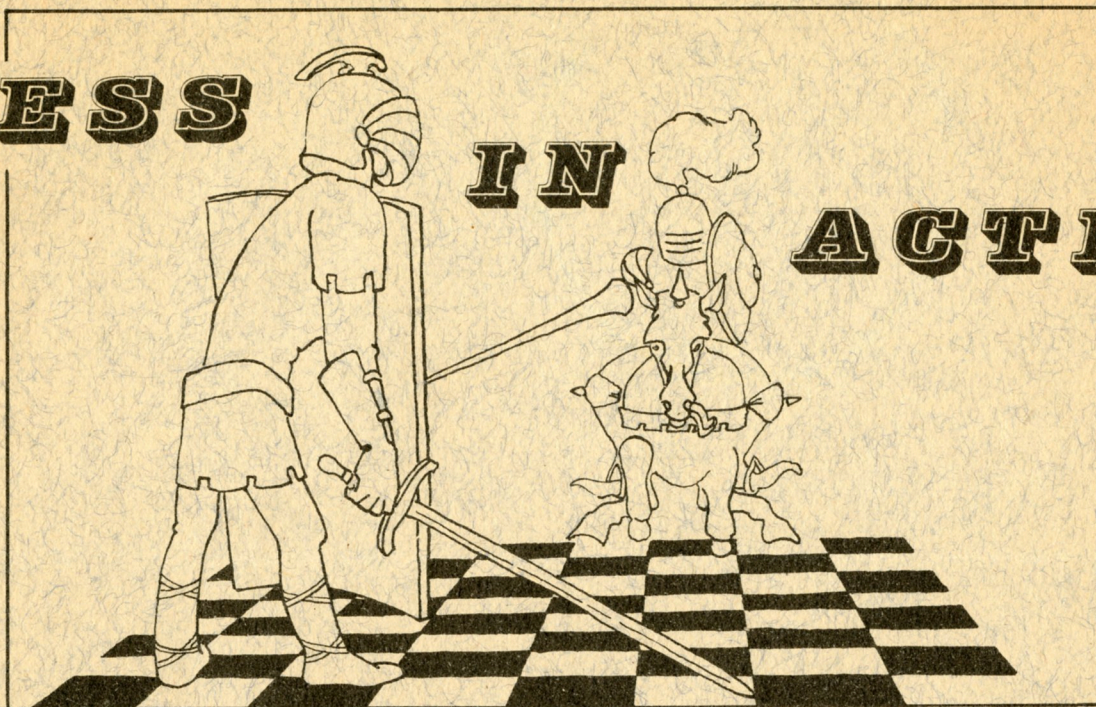

OAKLAND, CALIFORNIA. FEBRUARY 28TH - MARCH 1ST, 1959 - RESULTS:

"A" CHAMPION THE EXPERT-A TOURNAMENT WAS WON BY DAVID KRAUSE, 17 YEARS OF AGE, FROM PALO ALTO. DAVE WAS TAUGHT CHESS AS A CHILD, BUT ONLY STARTED TO PLAY SERIOUSLY IN THE 8TH GRADE. HE HAS CONTINUED HIS CHESS INTEREST THROUGH HIGH SCHOOL AND AT PRESENT IS A SENIOR AT CUBBERLY HIGH SCHOOL, PALO ALTO. DAVE PLANS TO ENROLL IN THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA FOR THE FALL SEMESTER, 1959. HE HAS PLAYED IN CHESS FRIENDS OF NORTHERN CALIFORNIA COMPETITIONS FOR FIVE YEARS AND HAS BEEN A MEMBER OF THE LOS ALTOS CHESS CLUB SINCE JOINING CFNC. THE FOLLOWING ARE ELIGIBLE TO PLAY IN THE FIRST EXPERT TOURNAMENT: THE FIVE FIRST PLACED IN THE CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT OF CHESS FRIENDS OF NORTHERN CALIFORNIA HELD FEBRUARY 28TH AND MARCH 1ST, 1959 AND THE FIVE HIGHEST RATED PLAYERS, MEMBERS OF CHESS FRIENDS OF NORTHERN CALIFORNIA FOR AT LEAST SIX MONTHS. IF A PLAYER IS CLASSIFIED BY WINNING A PLACE IN THE CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT AND IS ALSO QUALIFIED AS ONE OF THE FIVE HIGHEST RATED PLAYERS, THE NEXT IN LINE IN THE RATINGS WILL BE INVITED.

TYPE OF TOURNAMENT: ROUND ROBIN
PLACE: WAR MEMORIAL BUILDING, 6655 MISSION STREET, DALY CITY, CALIFORNIA
ENTRY FEE: \$10.00 OF WHICH \$5.00 WILL BE RETURNED TO EVERY PARTICIPANT WHO COMPLETES ALL HIS GAMES.

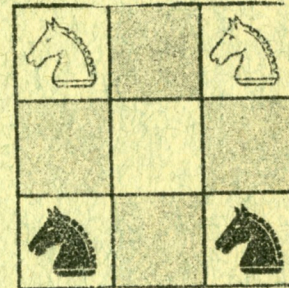

ONE OF THE PROBLEMS OF US SCIENTIFIC INVESTIGATORS (SECOND ONLY TO A PAUCITY OF PATRONS WITH PELF) IS A PAUCITY OF PUZZLES TO PROBE. UNFORTUNATELY, I EVENTUALLY DEVELOPED AN ALLERGY TO PAINT THINNERS AND SO HAD TO CRYSTALLIZE MY FINDINGS. MY BOOK "PAINTING WITH A BICYCLE" IS A MUST FOR ALL SERIOUS ARTISTS.

THEN I HEARD THAT THAW HIGHERDEAL WAS PLANNING TO INVESTIGATE EASTER ISLAND AND I DECIDED TO BEAT HIM TO THE PUNCH. I ACTUALLY ARRIVED ON THE ISLAND AHEAD OF HIM BUT AN INVOLVEMENT ON THE RETURN JOURNEY WITH THE "BRIGITTE BARDOT" OF BORA BORA (WHO HAD SEVEN BROTHERS ALL BIGGER THAN I) DELAYED MY RETURN TO CIVILIZATION.

EVER SINCE EASTER ISLAND WAS DISCOVERED IN 1722, IT HAS ATTRACTED WORLD ATTENTION FOR THE AMAZING GIANT STONE STATUES THAT TOWER OR LAY TOPPLED ABOUT THE ISLAND. THEIR

origin has mystified investigators and all sorts of absolutely fantastic theories have been offered as to why and how they were built. One of the more puzzling aspects of the mystery is the insistence of the older tribesmen that the statues "walked".

Not so well-known, but intellectually more exciting, was something else found on Easter Island - the boards and sticks covered with rows and rows of intricately carved symbols, one-third to one-half of an inch long. These KOHAU RONGOBOONGO or "talking sticks" have long defied decyphering. One feature of the wooden tablets is the peculiar alternation of the rows of writing, each successive line reversing direction in the method known as soustrophedon.

My researches go to show that, at one time, there were two other islands, one on either side of Easter, called "The Second Sunday after Epiphany Island" and "Beptuagebima Island". Both these islands were volcanoes and, as the superstitious and ignorant tribesmen believed, inhabited by Gods who actually thought rationally like human beings.

By a peculiar system of volcanotelepathy, "Second Sunday" and Beptuagesima" persuaded the superstitious and ignorant (but very strong) Easter Islanders to construct a set of giant chessmen out of volcanic rock. These were set up on Easter Island which was to become, in effect, nothing more than a gigantic chessboard!

The volcanoes moved the pieces by subterranean convulsions which flipped the giant men from place to place on Easter Island. Much the same effect can be produced on a minor scale by placing chessmen on a rug and then flapping the rug so that waves of air billow beneath and jerk the pieces into the air.

By the same volcanotelepathy, the volcanoes were able to persuade the RONGOBOONGO men or "chanters" to record their games on the talking boards.

What put an end to the games is difficult to say but it seems that "Second Sunday" got mad at losing every time and, in the ensuing eruptions, both volcanoes disappeared beneath the waves of the Pacific Ocean, leaving nothing behind except the giant toppled chessmen and a few recorded games on the strange talking boards.
