HERMAN STEINER MEMORIAL OPEN November 19 - 23. First round at 8.00 p.m. Friday, Nov. 19. Round 2, Sat 7.00 p.m. Round 3 and 4, Sun 9.00 a.m. and 2.00 p.m. respectively. Round 5 and 6, Mon 9.00 a.m. and 2.00 p.m. Round 7, Tues. 10.00 a.m.

GUARANTEED PRIZES - - First, \$500 Second, \$350 Third, \$250; Fourth, \$200; fifth, \$175; sixth, \$150; seventh, \$125, eighth \$75.  
TOTAL, \$1825.

MISSION BAY OPEN Times of rounds, four only, as above first four. Incidentally, this applies to both events, round One may be played on Saturday at 12.00, provided the entry fee is sent in by noon, Nov. 18.

GUARANTEED PRIZES First, \$100; second, \$50; third, \$25. Other cash prizes if funds permit, possibly for top woman player etc.
