An institution within the League, this establishment is organized similar to the Hall of Fame in baseball, and will honor the most outstanding chess personalities of the southland. Each year the League will elect a new entry by ballot; the honored recipient will receive a plaque in recognition of his contribution to chess, and a tribute to him and his achievements will be recorded in the League's Honor Roll. A "Hall of Fame" corner will be set up at the League Headquarters (Atlas Chess Club, 3351 W. 43rd St, L.A.), further honoring the selected members.

TERRACHESS salutes the League and entirely commends this great milestone in So. Calif. chess. It is most befitting in light of the tremendous strides made here since the early century, that the men and women who contributed most to chess in that time would be honored this way; and with the establishment of this feature, not only has the League taken another giant step forward, but is setting an example to all chessplayers and organizers everywhere. Hail SCCL!!

How will the Hall of Fame work? Here's the system:

The League has established a list of ten names of Hall of Fame candidates, as a starting point. One of these ten will be elected, by special vote at a League meeting each year; the vote being taken in a point-count system, allotting five points for a first choice, three for a second etc. Two-thirds of the possible 100% point-count is needed to declare an electee. The honored member selected will name a new entrant to the list, bringing the total number of eligibles again to ten; and so on. Those honored are not necessarily the best players; selection is based on the greatest merit deserved. More details of the Hall of Fame will be given at the Atlas Club Oct 1.
