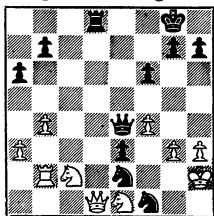

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TEAM MATCHES IN NORTH AND SOUTH; EL SEGUNDO ATTENDANCE RECORD

As the time drew near for the North-South team match on Memorial Day, champions were crowned in southern California, where the Steiner Club won Division A honors and Whittier won in Division B, and in the San Francisco Bay Area, where the University of California team took the title. The Steiner powerhouse won handily, its closest rivals, Santa Monica and Long Beach, being 7½ and 8 points behind, respectively. The Whittier team had a fight from the Pasadena team, but won by several points. At San Francisco, Cal fielded a strong team and won all its five matches. There was strong opposition, however, and the point margin was only 3½ points (out of 35 possible) over the two teams which tied for second.

At El Segundo, the third annual Open moved up into the big time. There were no less than 99 contestants, and club president Henry Shipin and his fellow workers can congratulate themselves. Dr. Anthony Saily won the first prize with a 5½ - ½ score. Seven players were tied for second place. Gordon S. Barrett directed.

SAIDY WINS BIGGEST EL SEGUNDO OPEN TOURNAMENT

Dr. Anthony F. Saily of Los Angeles scored five wins and a draw to win the third annual El Segundo Open March 31 - April 1-2. Tony, who was the highest-ranked player of the 99 contestants, drew an exciting time-trouble game with California Junior Champion Jim Tarjan in the fourth round and met Tibor Weinberger in the sixth and final round with four players tied with $4\frac{1}{2}$ points. Saily won from Weinberger while Robert Jacobs and State Champion Charles Henin drew their game.

Seven players tied for second: Bob Jacobs, Bob Reynolds, Charles Henin, Patrick Eberlein, Arthur Spiller, Karl Stani and Bill Stewart. The prizes were: 1st, A. Saily, \$200 plus trophy; 2nd trophy, R. Jacobs; 3rd trophy, Bob Reynolds (this young man from Santa Barbara started with a rating of 1799); Class A trophy, Bill Stewart; Class B trophy, Bob Reynolds (again!); Class C trophy, D. Welsh and C. Yergin; Ladies trophy, Greta Olsson; Upset trophy, R. Vance. Those tied for second received one-seventh of about \$400.

The tournament was sponsored by the El Segundo Chess Club (Henry Shipin, president) and the El Segundo Recreation and Parks Department. The tournament director was Gordon S. Barrett. The scores:

BAKER WINNER IN THIRD ANNUAL VISALIA AMATEUR OPEN TOURNAMENT

Dale Baker of Bakersfield won the first prize at the College of the Sequoias in Visalia March 17-19 with a perfect 6-0 score. Dennis Littrel of Long Beach was second, $5\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$; Arthur Stobbe of Visalia was third, 5-1; and George Oakes of Salinas tied with John Davidian of Sun Valley for fourth, $4\frac{1}{2}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$. The main prizes were: 1st, \$75 plus trophy; 2nd, \$25 Class A trophy, George Oakes; second Class A plus 1st Junior, John Davidian; 1st Class B, A. Stobbe, \$20 plus Best Colleege of the Sequoias trophy; 2nd Class B trophy, V. Fagin; Class C trophy, J. Wilson; Classes D and E trophy, T. Morris. GAME OF THE MONTH

Akiba Rubinstein was one of the post-WWI chessmasters who dominated chess for a long, long time. In the era before the term "grandmaster" was coined, romantic chess was in vogue. Champions were challenged on a free enterprise basis - usually only when the challenger raised some money. Most of the best players were former child prodigies, to whom chess was instinctive. Capablanca, for instance, scarcely ever read a book on chess. To him it was as natural as speaking.

Rubinstein learned chess at the comparatively late age of 18. He always played chess the hard way, and in the deep thought which was necessary for him he sometimes made blunders. But he also produced many brilliancies, some of which ranked among the best ever played. He never became world champion, but he became known for the purity of his play and at his best he was a match for anyone. In his late years he developed signs of mental illness. In retrospect, mental instability would appear to be the flaw which prevented him from attaining the championship.

Vera Menchik was a lady champion during a time when practically no other lady chessmasters were around. Her play was so strong that the great masters of the age were compelled to form a "Vera Menchik Club" composed of those who had lost to her. Menchik died a tragic death. As Vera Menchik Stevenson, wife of the well-known English chess patron, she was killed during the early days of WWII by an airplane propeller.

The great tournament of Carlsbad, July-August 1929, was one of the strongest ever held. The openings books are full of examples of play by the great masters in the Carlsbad tournament. It was a compliment for Miss Menchik even to be invited to play. But when she met Rubinstein it was a disaster for the lady. Rubinstein refused to join the club!
