New club members can only start in class "B" or "C" unless they have a USCF Rating of 1500 or more.

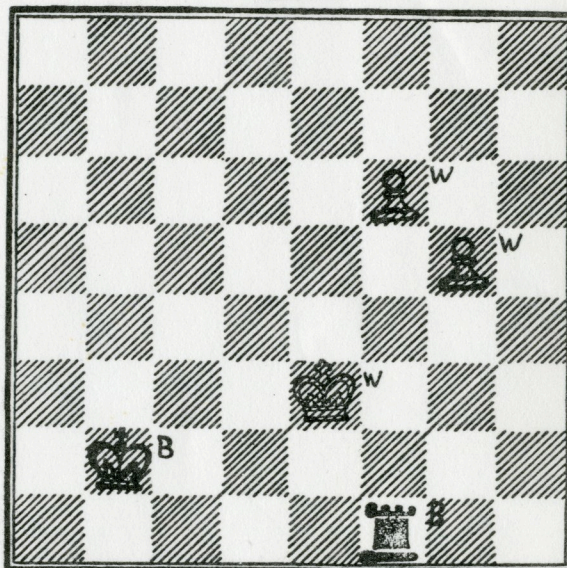
