

Winners Of Chess Contest

Top winners in The Chronicle's "Chess With the Giants" contest are Dennis Saccuzzo of San Francisco and Dr. David J. Tepper of Oakland, chess writer George Koltanowski announced yesterday.

Saccuzzo, 15, and Dr. Tepper, who mailed in suggested moves for Koltanowski's game with Paul Keres of the Soviet Union, each won \$62.50. Both received 102 out of a possible 120 points.

Third and fourth prizes were shared by Ron Thacker, of Oakland; Henry H. Lee, Don Sutherland and James McNeese, all of San Francisco, each winning \$10. Each received 98 points.

Although the contest ended at move No. 30 last Sunday, the game will continue and be reported in the Chronicle.

Koltanowski said 320 contestants finished the game out of 650 beginning entrants.

MISTAKES

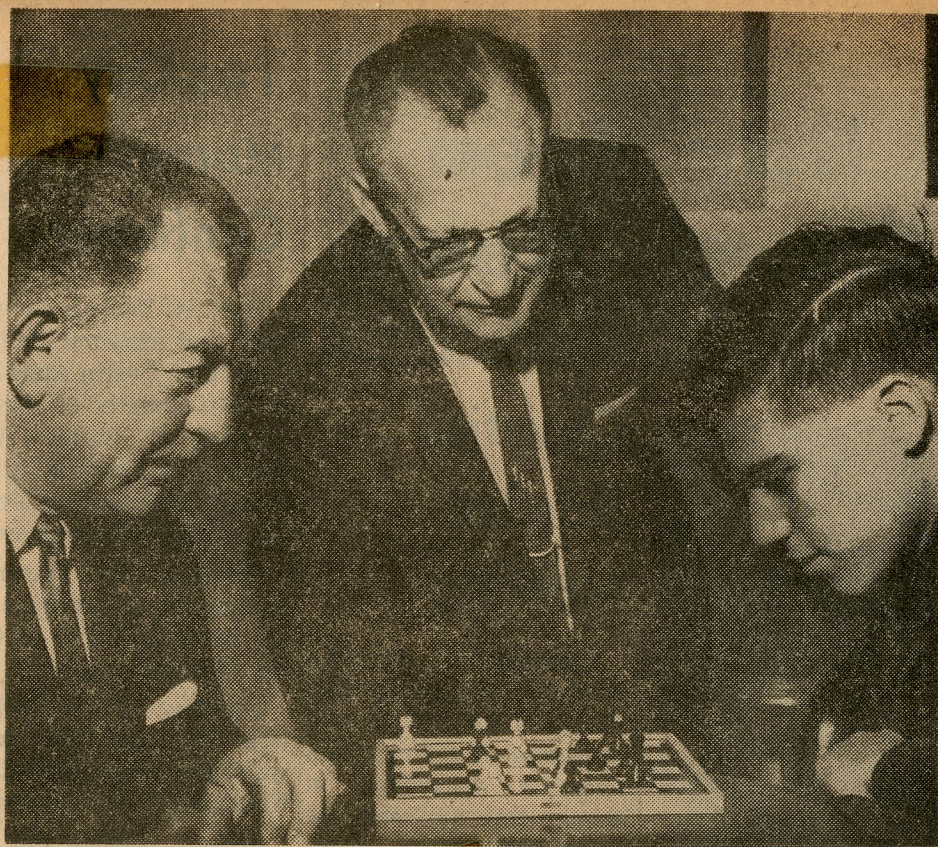

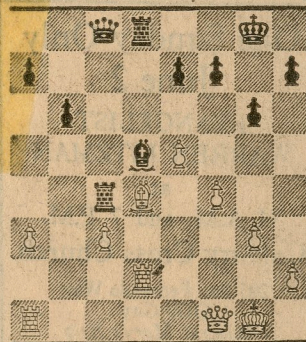
GEORGE KOLTANOWSKI WATCHES CHAMPS TEPPER AND SACCUZZO
