PLAYERS FORM A CHESS CLUB.

QUARTERS LEASED IN HIGGINS BUILDING FOR USE.

Correspondence Matches To Be Played With San Diego—Court Street Aggregation Disbands And Members Join New Organization. House-warming Thursday.

A group of chess and checker players headed by J. W. Watson, James Grant and Ira B.
