

Los Angeles, Sept. 8.—Alexander Bisno, 62, a Beverley Hills investment counsellor who was captain of a United States chess team which played Russia in 1955, was convicted yesterday of concealing more than 170,000 dollars in assets from a bankruptcy referee. The chess expert faces a maximum sentence of five years in federal prison and a 5,000 dollar fine.

Bisno was charged with the count after the Moulin Rouge Hotel and casino in Las Vegas, Nev., went broke in 1956. He was a part-owner of the establishment in which creditors had invested 5 million dollars."
