## FISCHER WRAPS IT UP

Inflicting his fourth straight defeat on former world champion Tigran Petrosian, Brooklyn-born Robert Fischer reached the requisite 6½ points to win the final candidates' match in Buenos Aires. Fischer will meet current holder Boris Spassky of the Soviet Union for a 24-game match in 1972.
