With the United States Chess Federation paying the bill, a 9½-hour telephone chess match between San Francisco and Miami produced a tie result, Feb. 11-12. Six-man teams played at a fast time control of 40 moves an hour, as tellers Alan Benson, Kenn Fong and Peter Prochaska transmitted and relayed the moves of the games for the San Francisco contingent. Demonstration boards were maintained for the crowd of chess buffs attending the long-distance marathon, held on three floors of the Gambit Game Store, 625 Kearny St.
