BOTWINNIK leads 2 - 1 against PETROSIAN after three rounds! As you know, the World Champion won his first game, the next two were drawn, one quickly, the other slowly.

So. Calif. Chess League official changes: Herbert ABEL, who has been doing a great job as Tournament Director, felt compelled to resign his post with effect May 1 for a number of reasons. A new appointment will be made at the coming League meeting, probably at the end of the team matches.....William ADDISON, California Champion, was appointed as League Youth Director. ADDISON has been doing tremendous work in the field of supporting schools in the area, in fact donated a High School Trophy to the Salesian School after their recent team tournament.
