CHARLES HENIN - NEW CALIFORNIA CHAMPION - 1969

The great year of 1969 ended on a real high note for renowned So. Calif. master Charles HENIN, who once again added the State title to his already numerous crowns. (He's won the event earlier in the sixties.) HENIN scored $4\frac{1}{2}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$ to finish $\frac{1}{2}$ point ahead of the 1968 titleholder, David BLOHM. It all hinged on the last round game between these two stalwarts, and since HENIN only needed a draw to secure the title, the odds were in his favor - and it took him only a comparatively short time to achieve his goal. His only loss occurred in the preliminary rounds against Aki KANAMORI, who later beat BLOHM as well for his only two points in the tournament!

1969 was a stormy year, and it ended on a stormy note. It all started when only seven players were present for the first round on Friday. Of the three absentees, two players (ADDISON and BAISLEY) have informed or sent word to the Tournament Director earlier to state that they would not play in the finals; however, no word was received from the third, Norman WOOD. Since the latter did not show up all day Friday, missing two rounds, T.D. Darrell RADER (directing on Friday since your editor was unavoidably detained by a business appointment) assumed WOOD was forfeiting the finals and, to save a day especially for the northerners who had a long distance to travel, rescheduled the remaining games so as to finish all but one game by Saturday evening. Sometimes, however, the best intentions don't work: WOOD turned up Saturday morning, after start of the third round, wanting to play. (He had apparently misread the dates, believing the tourney to be held on Sat-Sun-Mon.) T.D. Gordon BARRETT, after conferring with other League officials, ruled that as a bona-fide participant, WOOD could play, since his forfeiting three games in a round robin did not affect the pairings and was not any rule infraction. The ruling meant that the rounds had to be rescheduled again, with more games on Sunday; and the prize fund was revised to include 8 prizes instead of 7.

This caused a protest from David AMKRAUT and, especially, David BLOHM, who thus had an earlier loss to WOOD "reactivated." The protest was on several points, but mainly hinged on the fact that the players would have used different game tactics had they realized that there'd be an extra round.

In the ensuing argument, BARRETT agreed to consult HASHDAN, President of the Calif. State Chess Federation, on the matter. KASHDAN spent over 20 minutes dispersing the two players' windpuffs one by one, using solid logic and sound judgment, in upholding BARRETT's decision. Then the whole matter took an unexpected turn when WOOD declared he was withdrawing. Thus the protesters were appeased, but naturally at the dismay of others. And so ended the 1969 State Championship.

Doug LINN, League Secretary reports some momentous decisions reached at the last League meeting. The highlights:

1. Elections - The following were placed into office for 1970:
President: Gordon BARRETT
Vice-President: Benton JAMES
Tournament Director: Donald COTTEN
Asst. Tournament Director: Henry SHIFIN
Treasurer: Larry HOKE
Secretary: Douglas LINN
Outgoing President Darrell RADER was nominated for special projects officer, but declined the nomination.
2. Hall of Fame - Some other type of recognition, other than that presently given, suggested for some of the Hall of Fame nominees, particularly those deceased.
3. The El Segundo Chess Club is giving honorary lifetime memberships to Hall of Famers.
4. A change in the nomination system for Hall of Fame suggested but not approved until a later meeting.
5. Team Matches - To start the first Sunday in March.
6. The Division 1 section will, as in the past, be rated and USCF membership will be required.
In the second, third and other divisions it will be left to the individual team captains to decide whether or not the matches will be rated; if so, they will submit the reports directly to the USCF.
7. Mystery!
8. Morphy Day - will be held May 9 at a site to be announced later.
9. The League Participation award was won in 1969 by the Student Chess Club.
10. It was suggested and is being considered that we have a special award for outstanding performances by players on the various boards in the team matches a la Olympics.
11. The Merit Award Point winner for 1969 was Ross STOUTENBOROUGH of Riverside. He will receive his prize later, probably on Morphy Day.
Better understanding and participation in the Merit Award Point program stressed for 1970.
12. It was suggested that a card be sent to Tournament Directors, stating requirements regarding MAP participation and collection of monies.
13. Calpoints will be in effect again this year with approx. ten Calpoint tournaments scheduled.
14. Prepaid entries into the So. Cal. Championships should be secured by every club from their club tourneys - these to be given instead of trophies or other prizes.
15. Mr. BARRETT's platform as incoming President is to try and get more people into clubs, particularly juniors.
16. Expert Candidates finals on June 13-14, with 5 rds preliminaries at member clubs.
17. A calendar of major events is to be published and issued soon.
18. Next important team captains' meeting Thurs. February 12.
