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TEAM MATCH CHALLENGE

Roger Blaine has sent inquiries to several other chess clubs in the area to see if they are interested in playing USCF-rated team matches with us. First we need to know who is interested in playing. A sheet will be posted at each club meeting to sign your name, rating, whether you are willing to travel, and what nights you are able to play. Most of the matches will be on nights other than Thursday, at least while our tournament is going on. Lower-rated players are encouraged to sign up. Many other clubs are smaller than ours, so most matches will probably have between 5 and 10 boards.

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A POSTAL CHALLENGE has arrived from Rolf Ebmeyer, Grawelandstr. 13, 4904-Enger, West Germany. Mr. Ebmeyer is a war invalid who has taken up international chess by mail on a large scale. He sends moves by international numeric notation, and his first move in Game "A" is 1. 5254 (= e2-e4 or P-K4). Anyone desiring to play may obtain the first card from Roger Blaine.

DIESEN & ROHDE WIN US JUNIOR INVITATIONAL Mark Diesen, 18, and Michael Rohde, 16, tied for first with 5-2 at Memphis, Tenn. Diesen will represent the US in the World Junior Championship, and Rohde will compete in the International Youth Tournament.

DIANE SAVEREIDE DEFENDS WOMEN'S TITLE with 8-2 score at Teton Village, Wyoming, in July. Ruth Herstein and Dorothy Teasley tied for 2nd with 6-4.

3-WAY TIE IN MANHATTAN INTERNATIONAL TOURNEY in July between Norman Weinstein, Anatol Lein, and Leonid Shamkovich, each 10½-4½. Weinstein missed the Grandmaster norm by ½ point, but the outstanding 16-year old Michael Rohde made the norm for International Master with 9-6.
