

# Close Finish In Industrial Chess Race

A close race has developed in the Bay Area Industrial League chess tournament. At the end of round 7, Shell Development is leading with 41½ points and the University of California Radiation Laboratory in Berkeley is a close second with 40 points. These two teams will meet this week in what may well be the deciding match for first place. PG&E looks like a sure thing for third position.
