Capital City Chess Club Championship - 1935

Starting Date - Oct. 9th.

Entries should be in by Oct. 2nd.

Entries should be given to either Austin, Chapman, or W. Trousdale.

Entry fee is 50¢, to be used for prizes.

Kirk-Holland Plan. (for 16 players)

First Round. Each player draws a number (1 to 16). #1 vs #16, #2 vs #15, etc., the odd numbers play the white pieces. This divides the field into two groups, I and II.

Second Round. Players in group I draw numbers (1 to 8). #1 vs #8, etc. The odd numbers play the white pieces except where the opponents have met in the first round in which case they will play with opposite colors. Group II follows the same procedure. As the loser is not penalized in the first two rounds, which are merely to group the players, the black pieces will be considered to have won drawn games. (Rounds 1 and 2 only)

Third, Fourth, and Fifth Round. The players are now separated into four sections (a, b, c, d) of four players each. Each section plays a Round Robin; wins scoring 1 point, draws $\frac{1}{2}$ point, and losses 0 points.

Sixth, Seventh, and Eighth Rounds. These are the final and most important rounds. The players are then divided into four classes according to the results of the Round Robin (3rd, 4th, 5th rounds).

Class A (Championship) Round Robin will be made up of:

From Section a; 1st and 2nd places
" " b; 1st place
" " c; 1st place

Class B (Consolation)

From Section a; 3rd place
" " b; 2nd place
" " c; 2nd place
" " d; 1st place

Class C

From Section a; 4th place
" " b; 3rd place
" " c; 3rd place
" " d; 2nd place

Class D

From Section b; 4th place
" " c; 4th place
" " d; 3rd and 4th places

If less than 16 players are entered the number of classes may be reduced to three.

Prizes: The Club will donate an amount equal to the combined entry fees and prizes will be given:

1. Winner Class A (Champion)
2. Runner-up (2nd in Class A)
3. Winner Class B
4. Winner Class C
5. Winner Class D

Playing Rules - The rules of the American Chess Federation will be in effect. The Club has copies of these if you don't know them.
