LATE UPSET CREATES 3-WAY TIE IN SWISS TOURNEY!

Wade Hendricks pulled a surprise win over heavily favored expert Jay Whitehead to set up a tie with Randall Feliciano in the last round of the Burlingame Spring Swiss Tournament, which ended May 13. All three men had 6-1 scores, with Whitehead taking the first-place trophy and Hendricks second on tie-break points. Class prize winners included: Class B - Greg Payne (5-2); 2nd B - Nick Tripolski (4½-2½); Class C - Donald Ried (5-2); 2nd C - Mark Hansen (5-2); Class D - Dale Saunders (4-3); 2nd D - Clarence Beale (3-4); Class E - Drew Desky (3-4); Unrated - Glenn Smith (4-3); 2nd Unrated - Jerry Twentyman (3-4). In the case of identical scores, trophies were awarded on the basis of Median and Solkoff tie-break systems.

Tournament director was Frank Flynn, assisted by Roger Blaine.
