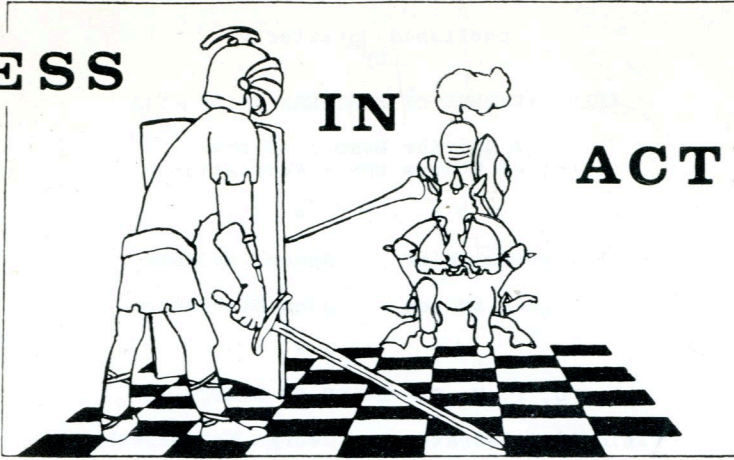

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The 2nd MONTEREY INTERNATIONAL OPEN CHESS TOURNAMENT will be held at the San Carlos Hotel in Monterey, on Saturday and Sunday, March 20/21, 1965. The tourney is open to all chess players who are (or will become) members of the United States Chess Federation, and it will be fully rated by the USCF. International Master George Koltanowski will direct. The tournament will be 5 rounds, Swiss System, and the entry fee is \$12.00. Two dollars of this amount will be sent to the USCF International Affairs Fund. USCF membership (one year: \$5.00) may be purchased at the time of registration. Current members must bring their membership cards, and all players are requested to bring boards, sets and clocks. Dining facilities are available at the hotel, and accommodations may be reserved by writing directly to the Hotel San Carlos (Franklin and Calle Principal, Monterey). The minimum guaranteed first prize is \$100. The cash distribution (based on 50 entries) is as follows: First Prize: \$150. cash -- Second Prize: \$75. -- Third Prize: \$35. cash. Last year there were 76 entries, and the prize fund totaled \$435. This year, cash awards will be evenly distributed between all classes as the number of entries permits. Prizes (other than cash) will be awarded to 2nd and 3rd-place finishers in every class. In addition, there will be various "surprise" awards. For more information, write to:

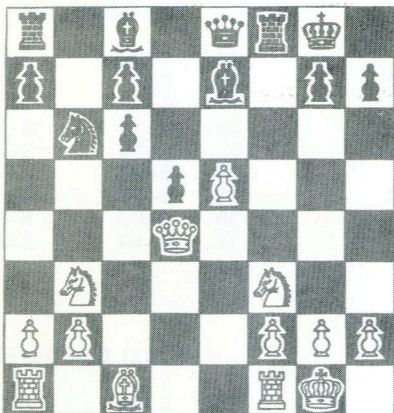

The 1964 Buenos Aires International Tournament showed the American Robert Byrne in great form. For an example of his fine play in this event, I present my 9th-round encounter with him. After Byrne's (playing Black against me) 13th move, the game arrived at this diagrammed position:



White has built up an advantage on the Q-side, and controls the black-colored squares there. But, at the same time, Black has several annoying counter-threats on the King's flank, beginning with 14...Q-N3 or 14...Q-R4. Also, the possible sacrifice ...RxN must be given serious consideration. White's best chance here probably was 14.KN-Q2 (not 14.N-K1, B-R3; 15.N-Q3, P-B4! etc.), but I did not want to post my pieces so unnaturally, and played instead 14.K-R1.

I had just made this move, when I noticed the terrific reply 14...P-B4! White cannot take the Pawn, as 15.NxP would be met by 15...RxN! 16.PxR, Q-R4; and now if 17.N-Q3, then 17...B-R6! with decisive effect, e.g., 18.N-B4, QxBP+; 19.K-N1, Q-N5+; 20.K-R1, B-N7+! etc. So, White should have continued with 15.Q-K3, but this would have led to a strategically lost game for him.

However, I was lucky in that Byrne did not see this opportunity, and continued 14...Q-R4; which was answered by 15.N-N1. White is now comparatively safe, and after 15...N-B5; should have met the threat to his K-Pawn with the simple 16.R-K1. But I went into complications again with 16.B-B4, NxNP! 17.N-R5, Q-N3; relying on the power of 18.QR-B1. Here I was caught by surprise, when my opponent answered 18...P-B4! Missing the relatively best opportunity for White (19.QxN, RxB! 20.N-N3, threatening 21.Q-Q2), I played instead 19.QxP+, B-K3; and then surprised Black with 20.N-B6!

At this point, I was already in no little time trouble, and was trying to determine how to continue after 20...B-R5. I had just seen that (after 21.Q-Q2, N-Q6) I had some defense possible with 22.B-N3, but what about 21...N-B5! -- ? I barely had time to consider the possibility 22.RxN, BxR; 23.R-B1, when my opponent played 20...QR-K1.

I am sure that this was not the best move available to Black, and that 20...B-R5 would have won for him, but even now my problems remained unsolved. There followed the practically forced sequence: 21.NxB+, RxN; 22.QxP, R/2-B2; 23.B-N3, N-Q6; 24.QxRP, NxR; 25.RxN, P-B3. White now has two Pawns for the exchange, and good chances to hold the position ... but the time trouble ... Now came 26.Q-R6, B-Q4; 27.P-B3, P-R4; 28.R-K1, Q-K3; 29.P-QR4?

White's position is still critical, but his last move was near suicide. 29.P-KR3 or 29.N-K2 should have been tried instead. Now came, of course, 29...P-N4! with the terrible threats 30...P-R5 or 30...P-N5. Now, having no real choice, I played 30.P-R4. At this point, Black has two good ways to continue: 1) the simple 30...PxP; 31.BxP, R-B4; etc.; and 2) the more forcible 30...P-N5; 31.P-B4, RxP! 32.BxR, RxB; with a decisive attack. However, the flag on Byrne's clock was now showing danger, so he played 30...R-B4. There followed, in "blitz" tempo, 31.Q-K2, R-R1; 32.Q-QB2, PxP, 33.BxP.

White now has nothing more to fear, and it therefore would have been most reasonable for Black to agree that his advantage no longer existed and to simplify to a draw by 33...RxP; etc. But -- the time trouble creates wonders. Byrne decided instead to concentrate on White's poor QR-Pawn, with 33...B-N6; 34.Q-Q3, RxRP and, after 35.Q-Q8+, he missed his saving chance (35...R-B1; 36.Q-N5+, K-R2), playing instead 35...K-R2? This "play for a win" is really a straight play for a loss, and if the first player had had more time in this position, the winning line for him (36.N-R3, K-N3; 37.P-B4!) would not have been difficult to find. However, feeling quite relieved at escaping from a most critical situation, I immediately continued 36.B-B6, and accepted Byrne's offer of a draw, having in mind the following probable sequence: 36...RxB; 37.QxR, QxQ; 38.PxQ, K-N3.

This was an extremely interesting, complicated and difficult fight, which, despite inexactitudes by both players, was warmly approved by the many spectators. Draws like this do not need any "30-move" rules!
