David Argall won the top section of the "Royal Round Robin Chess Tournament". Argall scored 5章-章, drawing only with Neuss. In the Process Argall ended Don Bicknell's 40-game streak without a defeat. Paul Koploy finished second with $4\frac{1}{2}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$, losing only to Argall. In the Dukes division Rick Falcco, Tom Mc-Cleary and W. E. Smith tied for first in Grandmaster fashion. They drew with each other and beat everybody else. All Three scored 6-1. Edwin Delong dominated the Lords section with a score of 7-0! He was first by a point and a half. Second place was shared by Charles Lautman and R.D. Martinez with scores of 53-13. Martinez' result was especially good for a player who had never played a rated game before. The tournament took place at the West Covina Chess

Club, which meets at Mesa School, on Barranca just South of the San Bernardino Freeway, every Friday evening from 7pm to midnight. Visitors are always welcome. David Argall directed the 24-player event.

DOWNEY "Downey Open '71" was the undormenting of the Eastside. Fifty-eight (58) players fought it out for the straight moola rewards. The prize fund increased with participants' increase. It ran just over \$500.00 even with expenses, the club gave away the coffee and tea. The entry was only \$10.50. The prize distribution was guided by a formula and with great success: 1st Ross Stoutenborough (5pts) winning \$167.00. 2nd Ron Gross & Julius Loftsson (42pts) winning \$41.50 each. "A" Berry, Klein & Rubin (4pts) winning \$27 each. "B" Ambrose (32pts) winning \$64.00. "C" Singerman & Korte (3pts) winning \$24.00 each. "D-E" Fowell & Bovetz (2½pts) winning \$16.00 each. "UR" Werner (3pts) winning \$26.00. Also 3 scoring achievement awards for Tolber, Stewart & Freeman (12 years olds). The formula was a graduating system but with possible pooling in the divisions except the unknown ("UR"). The objectives of this Director is not to scrape extra profits on guarantees, but to leave open the foor for the increase over the expectation. Also this Director is not going to set even \$\$ amounts for divisions. (Example): This tournament could have put \$50 to each div. "A" "B" "C" & "D-E", the "D-E" division had only 5 participants (in this tourney) the winners had 2 points (would that have been fair?). This even \$\$ amount system causes divisional ringers & they do exist, also it is an unneccessary handicap on the higher divisions. The system advocated by this Director leaves open lower divisions' eligibility to pool if earned. (By equal or higher score) If A-\$80, B-\$60, C-\$40 & D-E-\$20. (Example): A-3 pts, B-3½ pts, C-2 pts, D-2 pts therefore A & B pool even

"THE COMPROMISED KING-SIDE"

The three pawns in front of the castled king put up the strongest defense if they are left unmoved.

The wing is said to be compromised when one or more of the pawns have

advanced unfavorably.

The danger of such advances may lie in either or both of two circumstances: (A) Holes are opened through which enemy pieces may infiltrate.
(B) The advanced pawns become targets of attack, if only by way of

pawn exchanges to open files.

However, king-side pawn advances are often compulsory to strengthen certain defensive aspects; P-KB3 or B4 to allow guard of N2 by a rook on the second rank; P-KN3 to shield R2 from the adverse king bishop; P-KR3 to exclude a knight or a bishop from its KN5. For offensive purposes, the king is often denuded of his infantry, as in the attack spearheaded by P-KB4, P-KN4.

Thus it's not possible to make a generality saying the advance of any pawn in front of the castled king is weakening. It's probably true in a remote-theoretical sense, but the practical questions are; Is the weakening serious? Can it ever be capitalized? How far is it outweighed by the immediate gain in defensive or offensive power?
