Sonoma 7th Annual Chess Festival Set

The seventh annual chess festival will take place in Sonoma on Sunday, July 21, and will be dedicated to H. A. (Hutch) Whitehead, who has helped promote the yearly festival since its inception.

Sonoma is becoming the yearly meeting place for chess players from throughout Northern California. The festival is sponsored by the Sonoma Valley Chamber of Commerce and directed by International Chess Master George Koltanowski.

There will be a short tournament from 11 a. m. to 6 p. m. consisting of three games which may start as late as 2 p. m. and which will count if all three games are played. Entry fee up to and including July 17 is \$1.50. Late entry will be \$2.50.

A simultaneous exhibition is scheduled at 3 p. m. The fee for this is \$1. for those entered in the festival and \$2 for those who are not.

Bring family and friends, picnic on the plaza and play chess. There will be numerous trophies, books and merchandize prizes.
