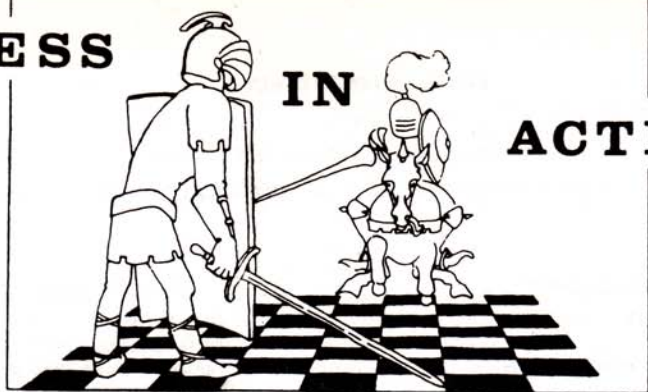


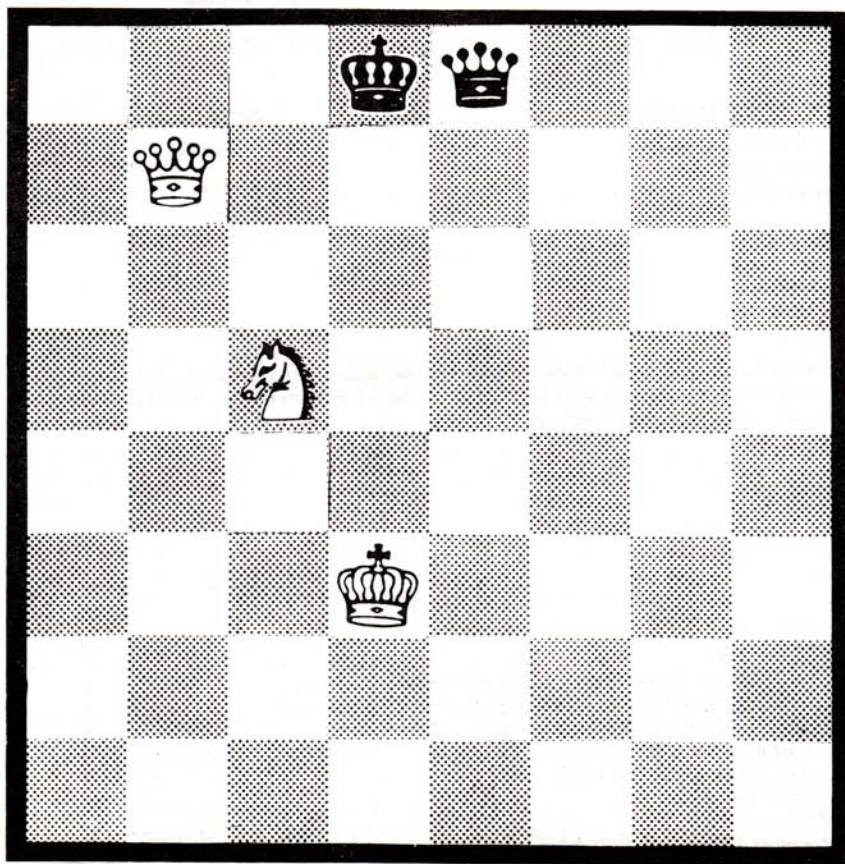

WHITE TO MOVE AND WIN IN ONE MOVE.

Solution to Problem shown on cover of our last issue: White can force the position shown above by making the following moves: 1 Q-B7ch K-R1; 2 Q-R5ch K-N2 (if K-N1, then 3 Q-N6 ch wins); 3 N-B5ch K-N1 (if K-B1 or K-B3, then white checks and wins the Black Queen); 4 Q-N6ch K-B1; 5 Q-N7ch K-Q1.

But what is White to do now? Additional checks appear to lead nowhere, yet White has a move available that forces Black's immediate resignation. Try to find the one-move solution. If you cannot, then turn to page 9.

Tournaments. Results of the 1968 Oakland Open Chess Tournament are presented on pages 4, 5, and 6. Over 100 players participated in this tournament. Results of the Fifth Annual Oakland Summer Chess Tournament are presented on page 7. These two CFNC events were sponsored by the Oakland Chess Club.

The next upcoming CFNC tournament is the 1968 Class Championship Tournament to be held at the LERA main auditorium on the weekend of September 21/22, 1968. Over \$500 in cash prizes and 20 trophies are being offered as prizes (see page 14 for further details). Following this tournament, the Carlmont Chess Club is sponsoring the 1968 Carlmont Open Chess Tournament at the Carlmont YMCA on the weekend of October 6/7, 1968 (see back cover for further details). Then, on October 12/13, 1968 the Novato Chess Club is sponsoring the First Annual Greater Redwood Empire Open Chess Tournament at the Novato Community House, Novato (see page 15 for further details). International Chessmaster George Koltanowski will act as Tournament Director for all three of these events.

League Play. Results of the 1967/1968 CFNC League Runner-Up playoffs are presented on page 8. Congratulations are extended to Daly City for winning the Runner-Up title with fine victories over Concord-A and the Berkeley Bears.

The 1968/1969 CFNC League season is just around the corner. All clubs interested in entering one or more teams should send a team representative to the Team Captain's Meeting to be held September 16 (8:00 p.m.) at the Hayward Chess Club, 2058 D Street, Hayward. Rules of play will be established for the coming season. It is planned that round-by-round newsletters will be mailed to all team captains (see page 8 for further details).

Ratings. We continue the CFNC policy of using the IRS (instantaneous rating system) for tournaments and league play whereby each player knows his rating before each game, knows his handicap rating once his opponent is known, and knows his new rating as soon as his game is finished. The rating list (pages 10 through 13) includes the results of all league games. Next season we plan to rate league games round-by-round.

Club Support. We continue the CFNC policy of providing support to chess clubs sponsoring chess events; this includes providing score sheets, wall charts and pairing cards; it also includes placing tournament notices and tournament results in "Chess In Action."

Board Action. It is with considerable regret that the CFNC Executive Board accepts the resignation of Chuck McGinley as Regional Director in the East Bay, and accepts the resignation of International Chessmaster George Koltanowski as Publicity Director. Both Chuck and George have served CFNC for a great many years and are fully justified in "retiring". They both expressed the same feeling "it is time for new people to take over the responsibilities of maintaining CFNC as the chess organization that provides chess events for the average chess players". This leaves the burden of responsibility on Jim Hurt, Dave Betanco, Dick Phillips, and Mrs. Virginia McGinley. Roy McCollough is Regional Director in the Contra Costa area, and we need Regional Directors in the East Bay, San Francisco, Peninsula, Hayward, Richmond, Novato, and other areas. Anyone who is interested in becoming a Regional Director for any of these areas, is hereby requested to notify Jim Hurt, and your application will be presented to the board for action.

The next CFNC Board Meeting will be held at the LERA main auditorium on Wednesday night, October 16, at 8:00 p.m. Any chess enthusiast interested in becoming a CFNC Regional Director is urged to attend this meeting.

Club News. The Oakland Chess Club and the LERA Chess Club held a 22-player challenge match on August 2, 1968 (page 9). The Daly City Chess Club and the LERA Chess Club held a picnic on August 18, 1968 (page 9). LERA Chess Club is starting their C-tourney on September 11, 1968. New clubs are forming along the Peninsula, in San Francisco, and Novato. The IBM Chess Club is one of the clubs that had a summer vacation, but is now back to holding regular meetings getting ready for fall tournaments and league play.
