REPORT OF LAST YEARS ACTIVITIES: The Club Championship was won by Kenny Fong with great ease. He had a perfect score in a field of 10 players.

Tied for second place were Paul Friedrich, Robert Pellerin and Hans Poschmann.

16 players started for our most valuable trophy, the "EBONY ROOK" in the customary Knock-out Tournament. As the smoke cleared after 4 rounds it was Kenny Fong again who was the sole survivor.

A fortified Fremont Team with Martin Sullivan, Kerry Lawless, Kenny Fong and Jon Wooley captured the perpetual trophy in the Premier Division of the Cal Chess Team Championship against strong opposition from the South Bay.

Martin, Kerry and Kenny also received plaques for Best Board 1.2 and 3.

Ed Sheffield was Best Board 2 on our not so successful second team in the Reserve Division.

Our participation in the Peninsula Chess League should get us a good middle place since we lost to a strong LERA team and to San Jose Chess Club.

The most recent Speed Tournament was won by Hans Poschmann because the stronger players were absent.

CLUB RATINGS:

The club rating system will be revived. It will work the following way: 16 points + 4 % of the rating difference will be awarded to the winner and deducted from the looser if the lower rated player wins, 16 points - 4 % if the higher rated player wins. In case of a Draw 4 % of the rating difference will be awarded to the lower rated player and deducted from the higher rated player. To get started on the Club Rating Ladder the most recent USCF rating will be used. For unrated players the performance in the first three games will be used to estimate the starting point. Pererhaps we can award some prizes for the most rating points gained in a three month period.
