

The annual tournament for the California state championship was completed in San Francisco early in October. A. J. Fink and H. Gross, each  $5\frac{1}{2}$ — $2\frac{1}{2}$ , tied for first place. By winning the extra game to break the tie, Fink became state champion for 1928-9. Dr. W. R. Lovegrove,  $4\frac{1}{2}$ — $3\frac{1}{2}$ , finished third. Other scores: D. J. Vedensky,  $3\frac{1}{2}$ — $4\frac{1}{2}$ ; H. Borochow, 1—7; S. Rubinstein, withdrew.
