

Soviet Chess Masters Honored at Banquet

Two Soviet chess masters who tied for the championship in the Piatigorsky Cup before 200 guests at a dinner Tuesday night at the Beverly Hills Hotel.

Tigran Petrosian and Paul Keres accepted the large Piatigorsky Cup, emblematic of victory, from Mrs. Gregor Piatigorsky at the International Chess Federation awards banquet, and received the lion's share of the \$10,000 prize money.

The honored guests included the Piatigorskys, the players in the tournament and Paul Marache, head of the Los Angeles city pension fund, who represented Mayor Samuel Yorty.

The chief speaker of the evening was Jerry Stann of Oklahoma City, vice president of the International Chess Federation and former U.S. Federation president.

Stann, who was instrumental in getting the foreign players to the local tournament, revealed that the U.S. Chess Federation hopes to hold the Piatigorsky Cup tournament on a regular basis every two years.

Intruders Rob Trujillo Brother

MIAMI, Fla. (AP)—Three armed Latins forced their way into the home of Luis Trujillo, brother of the former dictator of the Dominican Republic, and made a futile search for some documents Monday, the family told police.
