**BOBBY: Checkmate** 

Oddball chess champ flips for teen fan - rook, line and sinker!

Oddball chess master Bobby Fischer — who once said, "Girls are nice but chess is better!" has fallen so hard for a bespectacled roly-poly teenage fan that he's just a pawn in her hands.

Although the queen in 49-year-old Fischer's life is young enough to be his daughter, 19-year-old Zita Rajcsanyi of Hungary has checkmated the chess king's heart.
