

In Test No. 23 if you had the first move, you had the idea so, did you get 1. . . N-N5ch? If now 2.PxN, then RxRch; 3.KxR, QxQ; wins. Thus White only has one good move at his disposal: 2.QxN; Q-Q3ch; that forces 3.P-N3; and now Black continues with 3. . . . Q-Q7ch, 4. . R-B7ch; 5.K-N1, Q-K8 mate. Points in this test are much higher:

10-20 seconds: 40 points 21-60 seconds: 30 points 61-120 seconds: 15 points If

121-150 seconds: 10 points 151-180 seconds: 6 points If more than three minutes: 4 points
