



U.S. CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT

We recently received a mimeographed announcement of the U.S. Championship Tournament to be conducted by the U.S. Chess Federation at the Marshall Chess Club. New York, from May 29 to June 13. This tournament has been designational chess Federation at the International Chess Federation (FIDE).

In accordance with the resolution adopted by the USCF board of directors at Milwaukee last year, the following players have qualified: The three from the 1951 U.S. Championship, Evans, Reshevsky, Pavey; five from the U.S. Open. 1953, Hearst, Horowitz, Rossolimo. Byrne. Sherwin; six from the Philadelphia Candidates Tournament. Bisquier. Berlinner, Burger, Brandts, D.i Camillo and Wachs. According to Averill Powers, chess columnist of the Milwaukee Journal. "It is doubtful that Samuel Reshevsky will enter the meet because of the limited Drize fund."

There is a question in the mind of your editor whether this tournament can legally be designated as a qualifying zonal of the FIDE because the participants of this tournament re limited to qualification and this appears to be an afterthought and not in accordance with FIDE rules. There are many qualified.

players in the United States automatical ly eliminated by this ruling. We are sure the chess playing public would lik to know why an international zona tournament, governed by the FIDE should not be open to all qualified players and why the USCF restricts it to only 14 participants who qualified fo the U.S. Championship!

BOTVINNIK HOLDS LEAD

Mikhail Botvinnik, world champion. continued to hold his lead last week in his 24-game chess match with Vassily Smyslov in Moscow. After 20 games the standing was Botvinnik, 10½; Smyslov.

With four more games to be contested.

With four more games to be contested. Botvinnik's lead was reduced to one point after Smyslov's victory in the 20th game. Subtle play in the long-drawn-out ending enabled the challenger to capitalize on his promising position at the time of adjournment and to win in 72 moves. according to a report to the New York Times.

It was Smyslov's sixth victory Botvinnik has won seven times and drawn

Smyslov, playing the black pieces in
the 20th game, followed the lines of
the King's Indian Defense for nine moyes,
as in the 16th game, and then switched
to a continuation leading to a promising king's side advance.

Botvinnik, in the 19th game, again
succeeded in holding off his challenger
by scoring a draw.
