FISCHER FAR AHEAD IN U.S. TITLE RESULTS

The final cross-table of the United States Chess Champion-ship Tournament points up the magnificent performance of six-time winner Bobby Fischer.

six-time winner Bobby Fischer. His perfect score of 11-0 left the rest of the field far behind. In second place was former champion Larry Evans, who won the title in 1961, when Fischer did not participate. Evans won six games, drew three and lost to Raymond Weinstein as well as to Fischer.


