



RESHEVSKY LEADS NAJDORF

NEW YORK. June 27—Samuel Reshevsky of New York, still retaining a one-point lead in his match with Migue Najdorf of Buenos Aires for the cheschampionship of the west, began the 15th game of the series in the Argentine capital, according to a report received today. When play was adjourned after 40 moves, Reshevsky held the superior position.

Against the New Yorker's Queen Pawn opening, the challenger set up hi favorite King's Indian Defense. Up to point, the rival masters covered familia ground. Then Reshevsky began to concentrate on the center, which force Najdorf into a defensive role with little chance to strike back.

Reshevsky had recaptured the lead by winning the 14th game.

The challenger conducted the white pieces in the 14th game of the

Najdorf faced with new problems, failed to rise to the occasion. Grasping an opportunity to force an advance against the white king. Reshevsky essayed a surprise maneuver which was brilliantly successful. Najdorf resigned after 35 moyes. Reshevsky has won four games and Najdorf three. Six have been drawn. Play in the 13th game, which was adjourned twice and which looks drawish, was scheduled to be resumed today. Reshevsky won the 11th game early in the week to tie the score at 5½-5½.
