BERKELEY MAY DAY TOURNAMENT RESULTS

The fourth annual May Day Chess Tournament, sponsored by SUPERB and the U.C. Berkeley Chess Club, brought 119 players to the four-round, USCF-CalChess Swiss system competition held in the Student Union on the University of California Berkeley campus, May 17-18. Cash prizes totaled \$1,365, with an additional \$100 in California Chess Bulletins gift certificates rounding off the rewards for the winners in five divisions. Chief Tournament Director Alan Benson was assisted by USCF Local T.D. Mike Donald.

MONTEREY OPEN TOURNEY

Want to "warm up" for the Golden Gate and Paul Masson events next month? Attend the 1980 Monterey Open Chess Tournament, a four-round, USCF-rated Swiss system competition directed by Ted and Naomi Yudacufski at the Monterey Chess Center, 430 Alvarado St., in downtown Monterey, June 28-29.

The prize fund of \$600, based on only 60 entries, includes awards to overall first (plus trophy) and second, in addition to all six classes from "A" to "unrated." Special prizes go to top junior and senior (under 16, over 60), with an "upset" prize and "best game" award.

A drawing will be held prior to round two to give away a Drueke deluxe peg-in chess set and (for advance entrants only) a dinner for three at Monterey's Firehouse Restaurant.

Entry fee is \$15, if mailed by June 23 (otherwise \$5 more) to Monterey Chess Center, P.O. Box 1308, Monterey, Calif. 93940.

Round one begins at 11 a.m., Saturday, June 28, with a time control of 40 moves in two hours. A rapid-transit special will be held on Friday, the day before the tournament, at 8 p.m. (entry fee, \$2). For further information, please phone (408) 372-9790.
