CANADIAN WINS RECORD PAUL MASSON EVENT
The 1974 Paul Masson American Class Chess Championships took place May 25-27 at the scenic Paul Masson Mountain Vineyards in Saratoga, with a record 656 players competing for an unprecedented \$9,000 in cash prizes.

International Arbiter Martin Morrison directed the out-

International Arbiter Martin Morrison directed the out-door, six-round Swiss, USCF-rated tournament in celebration of the 50th Jubilee of the World Chess Federation.

A special added attraction was the presence of world blindfold champion George Koltanowski, who staged a chess show between rounds that was capped by a spectacular demonstration of his famous "knight's tour" exhibition.

Beating last year's champion, Kim Commons, in a tense, last round duel, Canadian champion and international master Peter Biyiasis emerged undefeated from the grueling event to claim first prize of \$2,350. Close behind in a second-place tie were international grandmaster Walter Browne, U.S. champion John Grefe, USCF master (2328) Roy Ervin and USCF master (2293) Dennis Waterman.
