

KOLTANOWSKI APPEARS TONIGHT!

The long-awaited appearance of International Master George Koltanowski will happen tonight at the Signal's special chess exhibition, schedule to begin at 7:30 p.m. in the main gallery at Cal Arts.

The public is invited to hear Koltanowski lecture on various aspects of the recently-completed Fischer-Spassky match in Iceland, and may ask questions of any nature about the game.

George Koltanowski, the editor of this column, is holder of the lifelong title of International Chess Master and is the former world's blindfold champion. At one time he held the world's records for simultaneous and consecutive games in blindfold play.

Recently he was elected as Vice President of the United States Chess Federation, and is one of the few International Referees appointed by the world chess federation. He is coming to Valencia having just directed the United States Open Tournament in New Jersey.

After the question-and-answer session, Koltanowski will demonstrate, if time permits, a sample blindfold game and his famous "Knight's Tour," a feat of memory in which he lists random names and numbers on every square of a giant chessboard, and then, without look-

ing at the board, jumps his knight from square to square calling out the items listed on every square.

The highlight of the exhibition will be his simultaneous match against the top 25 local chess players, picked from The Signal's recent tournament and from a special contest. The following is the line-up of those players:
