Congratulations to the new champions! After a long, hard-fought, and tiring match Sacramento handed San Jose its first defeat in years, and gained possession of the first of the new yearly trophies. In view of its large scale program for building talent, Sacramento may be hard to dislodge from first place in years ahead. Bill Haines of Sacramento won the prize of five dollars for the best individual score of the season, being the only player to record a perfect 6-0.

LEAGUE DIRECTORS MEETING, MARCH 16

September 21 was set for the first meeting next fall. A preliminary agreement was reached that Sacramento could enter two teams next season, with the top six men being permitted to play only for the first team. It was voted to combine the League Individual Championship and State Championship Qualification Tournaments. The combined tournament will be held April 26-27 in Pittsburg, probably at the C.I.O. Hall at Seventh and Los Medanoes. Registration will be noon April 26 followed by round 1 at 1 P.M. and round 2 at 7 P.M. The third round will be at 9 A.M. April 27 and round 4 at 2 P.M. The tournament is open to all League players who played in at least one League match during the 1957-1958 season. Solkoff points will be used, if necessary, to break tie for 1st to determine State Championship entry. League Championship may be held jointly. Prizes will be shared except that if more than three tie for 2nd or more than two tie for 3rd, the ties will be broken. The entry fee is 52.50, and prizes will be: 1st-50% 2nd-30% 3rd-20%.

The State Championship Prize Fund will be donated by member clubs at the annual League Meeting. All who intend to play in the tournament should notify Frank Olvera, 1155 Maple Street, Pittsburg, as soon as possible.

Edmondson, 417 Anders Drive, Mather Air Force Base, California, a complete list of the names and mailing addresses of all people who played this season. He will collect the information for forwarding to the USCF. A rating fee of 10¢ per game is required; unfortunately, it was never decided how to collect this money. Either each club can send in 5¢ per player per game to the Secretary-Treasurer, or else the whole amount (615-20) can be taken out of the League treasury. The Team Captains, therefore, will do well to get in touch with Capt. Edmondson and decide how to pay.

TIME TROUBLE The 60 moves in 2 hours time limit used the past two seasons has undoubtedly speeded up the completion of matches, and allowed weary chessplayers to arrive home quite a bit earlier and less weary. Also, it has undoubtedly lowered the quality of play somewhat, and brought about more time-pressure blunders and consequent frustration.
