Ed Edmondson won the 1957 Sacramento City Cness Championship in a tournament held November 16-17 at the Clunie Clubnouse. Fred Adkins won the Reserves Section. On December 11, at our regular weekly meeting, we tried a new event: the First Annual City Lightning Championship. The growth of chess enthusiasm in Sacramento was reflected in the turn-out, for 76 people came to the meeting that night. 36 entered the 10 second tournament, so it was divided into six qualifying sections of six players each. Top man in each section went into the Championship finals, second man in each section went into the Consolation finals. December 18 saw the completion of the finals, and the City Lightning Chess Championship went to Endre 10th, 3½-1½. Tied for second with 3-2 scores were Bill Haines, Mansur Saca, and Bill Rebold. The other finalists were Dr. Janushkowsky and George Flynn. Winner of the Consolation Tournament was Morris Tamres. Neil Austin was Tournament Director, with Ed Edmondson assisting.
