

# LOCAL & AFFILIATE NEWS

The following Novice Championships were held under the auspices of the New American Chess Winners.

The 1973 East Bay HS Novice, held in Hayward over the Thanksgiving weekend, was won by David Wait of Pleasant Hill,  $6\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ . Louis Melena (Union City) was top 9th Grader with 5-2. The USCF rated Championship section was won by Mike Riley ( Hayward) and Randy Fong (Hayward),  $3\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ , With Riley first on tie-break. The Junior High Section was won by Andrew Contopoulos of King Junior High ( Berkeley) with 4-0. Mr. David M. Smith directed.

William Nielson and Nicholas Markevitch tied for first in the 1st Annual San Francisco County Championship at the Sigmund Stern Grove Clubhouse on Jan. 19th. Each scored  $4\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ . The tournament was directed by Edward Delgado and Mr. David M. Smith.

The First Annual San Mateo County Novice Championship was held in Redwood City on Jan. 12, 1974. First place was taken by Julian Booth of Mt. View,  $4\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ . Next was Teruo Sunada of Redwood City, who as a county resident was awarded the title of 1974 San Mateo County Novice Champion. The Tournament was directed by Edward Delgado and Mr. David M. Smith.

The Los Altos Winter Open, directed by Jennie Kiesling, attracted 140 entries. Overall winners were Ruben Rodriguez and Alan LaVergne, each 5-0. CALIFORNIA STATE CHESS FEDERATION (CSCF) MEMBERSHIPS: \$2.50 (under 20), \$5 (21 and over) per annum. Benefits include a bimonthly California Chess Reporter subscription use of a CSCF Rating Card (to keep track of the member's approximate updated USCF rating), and eligibility for Calpoints to determine qualifiers to the California State Chess Championship.
