### A QUESTION OF TIME

There are, we are fairly certain, hundreds of thousands of chess players in these United States who neither join a club, nor spend a nickle on a chess magazine or book. Yet they would like to become good players. Unfortunately, they "do not have the time". That is the excuse we are always hearing and we are often inclined to believe it because these people usually think nothing about spending \$5 on a few rounds of Martinis. This leaves American Chess to be supported by a very small number of people, many of whom consider chess as a religion almost.

There are 168 hours in a week, and, if we take away 56 for sleeping, 50 for working and commuting, and 14 for eating, we are left with 48 Leisure hours. If you spent but one third of those on chess, the odds would be with you that you could become at least an "A" Player and maybe an expert. Here again, you get out as much as you put in. If you really wish to become an Expert, then you have to find the time for study, just as you have to find time to study to become an expert lawyer, engineer or accountant.

Time is something of an illusion. We can often accomplish more by purposely deluding ourselves. There is the case of the man with a clock that registers 36 hours in a 24 hour period. He can only operate his system at week-ends and vacations when unconcerned with the outside world but he does slice himself out a chunk of extra time. Actually, all he is really doing is better organizing his leisure hours so he can devote more to the study and play of the grandest game of all.




