

GAMES PLAYED IN THE "EXPERT TOURNAMENT" AT DALY CITY, CALIFORNIA

We felt that members would be most interested in the games played by our top ten experts in the First CFNC "Expert Tournament", held in May. So, we have asked each of the players to send us in one annotated game each. These we will publish as space permits, together with the balance of games (unannotated).

So far, we have received three annotated games (from the winners, naturally!) Hope the other seven players will soon get off the dime and send in their own contributions.

THACKER v. CLEGHORN

1. P-K4 P-K4  
2. P-KB4

Thacker plays the King's Gambit whenever he can, usually with success because he knows it very well. As I had lost a Gambit accepted to him in under 20 moves in a previous tournament, I decided to try for the initiative myself.

2. .... P-Q4

Thacker said, after the game, that this loses for Black, but I would play it even if this were true because White is on the defensive for a long time.

3. KP x P P-K5  
4. P-Q3 N-KB3  
5. N-QB3 B-N5  
6. B-Q2 P-K6  
7. B x P O-O

Thus Schulten - Morphy, New York, 1857 which this game follows to Black's tenth move but I think that 7 ..... NxP followed, if 8. B-Q2, by B x N and then O-O is a little better.

8. B - Q2 B x N  
9. P x B

If 9. BxB R-K1 ch. 10. B-K2 NxP attacking White's KBP and Black's lead in development becomes enormous.

9. .... R-K1 Ch.  
10. B-K2 B-N5  
11. K-B2

Shulten here played P-B4 which also is probably good enough.

11. ... BxB  
12. N x B N-N5 ch.  
13. K-B3?

White is probably lost after this, although he has better defences than as played. 13. K-B1 would also be bad because of Black's next move. K-N1 is correct.

13. .... Q - R5  
14. P - N3 ??

This move loses a Rook at best.

14. Q-N1 would hold for some time, the continuation being 14. ... N-Q2 (Threatening N-K4 check) 15. N-N3 P-KR4 and White's best is probably 16. P-KR3 N/2-K4 ch. 17. PxN NxP ch. 18. K-K2 (18. K-B2 Q-B3 ch.) Q x N 19. K-Q1 N-N3 and Black doubles on the King file.

14. .... Q - R6 ?

Q-R4 wins a rook after K-N2, QxP ch. etc.

15. R - QN1

Q-KN1 is better.

15. .... N - Q2 ?

Q-R4 again wins the rook.

16. R-N4 Q-R4

Now this only wins the exchange.

17. R-K4 N-B3 ch.

18. K-B2 NxR ch.

19. P x N RxP

20. N - Q4 Q x P

21. R-K1 QR-K1

22. Q-B3 N-B3

23. P-KR3 loses a piece

23. .... P-QB4

24. N-N3 RxR

25. QxQ ? KR-K7 ch.

26. Resigns

Although I have played games with fewer mistakes, and one shorter game (in the Tournament) I like this one best because of the interesting combinations and positions which came up (mainly in the notes) in it.

(a) With this move, white initiates the Yugoslav Attack, which has enjoyed much success over the board.

(b) Alternatives are 6.....P-K4, leading to a Fischer type position, and .....

"Expert Tournament" games, continued.

- 6.... P-KN3, allowing the regular Yugoslav Variation.  
 (c) Premature: B-K2 followed by 0-0 is probably better.  
 (d) 8 ... NxN; 9. BxN, P-K4; 10. B-K3, B-K3 might be a better alternative for black.  
 (e) White's plan is N-N3, P-R5, N-R4, and N-N6. This, however, creates a terrible weakness at QN4.  
 (f) P-Q4 or N-QR4 might also be considered.  
 (g) Black must stop P-R5.  
 (h) The QR belongs on QB1 and the KR on Q1.  
 (i) Preparing for P-Q4, but too late.  
 (j) If 14. .... Q-N5; then follows, 15. B-N6, R-QB1; 16. N-R2, QxRP (16. ... Q x NP; 17. B-Q4, Q-R6; 18. KR-N1, and white wins the black queen.) 17. P-B3, P-QR4; 18. N-N4, QxR; 19. RxQ, PxN; 20. PxP, and white should win but not without some troubles.  
 (k) 15. ... P-K4 is forced.  
 (l) If 17. ... QxNP; 18. KR-N1 and the black queen is trapped.



 (b) This development of the QN cramps Black's game. 8. ... Q-R4; 9. P-K4, PxP; 10. NxP, N-B3 is more energetic. However, 8. ... Q-N3; 9. B-N5 is better.  
 (c) If 11. ... N-B3; 12. Q-K2, Q-R4; 13. B-B4, B-Q2; 14. QR-K1 and White stands better. Objectively, the text move is best.

- (d) Not 13. QxP, QxQ; 14. RxQ, N-N3; 15. R-K2, NxP; 16. R-B2, N-R4; 17. Rxp, N-B3.  
 (e) If 13. ... P-B3; 14. QR-Q1, P-K4; 15. PxP, NxP; 16. P-N3, NxN ch.; 17. QxN, and White stands better.  
 (f) 14. ... PxP; 15. BxP, N-N3; 16. QxQ ch., RxQ; 17. QR-B1, B-Q2; 18. BxB, RxB; 19. N-Q4, P-B3; 20. P-QN4 favors White but is better than the text:-  
 (1) 16....KxQ; 17. BxB, KxB;  
 18. QR-B1, B-Q2; 19. N-Q4 ±.  
 Or 18.... B-K3; 19. N-Q2! +.  
 (2) 19. ... R-N1; 20 N-N5, BxN;  
 21. PxN, R-B2; 22 P-QR4! +  
 (g) If 18. ... B-Q2; 19. QR-B1, R-QB1; 20. R-B2 +.  
 (h) Black can resist longer with 24. ... B-Q2.
