

GLIGORIC IS COMING!!

International Grandmaster SVETOZAR GLIGORIC of Yugoslavia will give a simultaneous exhibition at the Oakland Chess Club on Friday, February 26, 1971 in his first appearance of his United States exhibition tour. Registration is from 6:15 to 7:00 p.m., and play will commence at 7:00. Entry fee for Club members is \$4.00; others \$5.00. Mr. Gligoric is eleven times Yugoslavia champion and frequent high-placer in International Grandmaster events. He played Fifth board in the historic U.S.S.R. VS. World Match in Belgrade, 1970, and placed second behind Bobby Fischer in Rovinj-Zagrev, 1970, and second behind Bent Larsen in Vinkovci 1970, to mention just a few of his many tournament accomplishments. In addition to his more than twenty years of international tournaments, Mr. Gligoric is the author of The Sicilian Defense Vol. 1, and Selected Chess Masterpieces, the latter based on his "Game of the Month" column in Chess Life and Review. Mr. Gligoric will personally autograph these books for his opponents who have copies of them. Dont miss this great event!!

Thirty chessplayers participated in the Oakland Chess Club's 1970 Bay Area Amateur Open tournament held at the CACA Oakland Lodge on December 19-20, 1970. Donald Clapp of Lafayette and David Smith of Minnesota split the first place prize of \$45 with $4\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$ points each. Anthony DiMilo of Carmichael won the first 'A' prize of \$20 with 4-1; Club member Robert Trenberth the first'B' prize of \$20 with $3\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$; and club members Richard Lee and Marcos Costa the first 'C' with 3-2 each (\$10 each). Other Club members who played were Craig Barnes, Steve Quen, Roger Alexander, Gary Kobliska, Juergen Kasprik, and Elwin Meyers. The tournament was dimected by Club tournament director Charles Maddigan.

Four Club members participated in the CCCA's 1971 4-Man Sectional Tournament held in Walnut Creek, January 2, 1971. Charles Maddigan placed first in the top section with $2\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$, followed by Craig Barnes 2-1. Gary Kobliska tied for 1st-4th in his section with $1\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$. Marcos Costa also played.

Marcos Costa played in the 'B*C' division at the Chessplayer's Tournament, an experimental, double-weekend, 6-round event held January 9-10 & 16-17 at Chabot College, Hayward. The event was an attempt at alleviating some of the inadequacies of weekend tournaments by slower time limits with time for adjourned games, a good playing site, and fringe benifits provided by tournament director and organizer Richard Shorman. 14 players participated in two divisions.

Craig Barnes won first place in the Club-sponsored 1971 6FNC East Bay Junior Championships. Since only 6 players played in this tournament that had 9 qualifying berths to the 1971 Northern California Junior Championships to be held at Stanford University February 27-28, all six players are eligible to play in the finals. The qualifiers from the 14-15yrs., 11-13yrs., and 10 and under division are Craig Barnes, David Sagan, Dennis Fung, Martin and Leslie Gee, and Kevin Lewis. It was played on Fan. 23.

USCF master and former Louisiana State Champion Jude Acers gave a simultaneous exhibition at the Oakland Chess Club on January 29, 1971. Mr. Acers played 20 games against 19 opponents, posting a score of 11 wins, 5 draws, and 4 losses. Club members Richard Hansen, Steve Quen, Edward Rosalia all won their games, and Roger Alexander, Marcos Costa, Charles Maddigan, Mike Weber, and non-member James Gettys all drew. Other Club members who put up fights were Richard Clemans, Jerry Gerhardt, Frank Warren, and Marvin Lee. The event was directed by Craig Barnes.

Craig Barnes and Steve Quen tied for first place in the 'A' division of the 1971 Golden Bear Class Tournament February 13-14 1971 in Berkeley. Both players posted perfect scores against tough 'A' competition and walked away with \$45 each. Charles Maddigan also participated in the 'A' division and Roger Alexander, Marcos Costa, and Raymond Cuneo participated in the 'B' division. A total of 102 chessplayers participated in four divisions.

Craig Barnes tied for forst 'A' prize in the 1971 Mechanics Institute Winter Rating tournament held February 20-21 in San Francisco. Gary Kobliska (2-2) and Marcos Costa $(l\frac{1}{2}-2\frac{1}{2})$ also played. Five people tied with each other for first place overall with $3\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$. Barnes scored3-1.
