The 1st Annual Monterey Peninsula Schools Chess Championship Tournament was held at the Casa Alvarado Chess Center, 494 Alvarado St, Monterey, on Saturday and Sunday, June 1 and 2.

There was no entry fee and the only qualification required of the student, (to high school senior), was a desire to play chess.

Co-sponsored by the Monterey Recreation Department, the Casa Alvarado Chess Center, the Monterey Peninsula Chess Club, and Mr Ron Ataluson, of Carmel, the tournament attracted 16 fine young players.

This group, divided into two eight-player groups, played a round robin system to determine the four players that would vie for the championship and runner-up places. The remaining 12 players met in a consolation tournament, with the winner receiving a prize.

Willis Cook, of the Robert Louis Stevenson School, emerged the Champion and also received a handsome trophy, and one year's membership in: The United States Chess Federation; the Casa Alvarado Chess Center; and the Monterey Peninsula Chess Club. Willis was also invited to play in the Monterey International Open Chess Tournament.

Bill Kondrat, of the Robert Louis Stevenson School, placed second. Mike Barthelow, Fremont Junior High, was third while Val Ushakoff, of Pacific Grove High, was fourth.

Tom Brunner, Pacific Grove High, was the consolation tournament winner, while Kim Howell, Junipero High and David Vining, Monterey High, were second and third, in that order.

Ted Yudacufski, assisted by his wife, Ruby, directed the tournament.

With more advance publicity, the 2nd Annual Monterey Schools Chess Championship Tournament should gather a much larger field. Perhaps more of the junior highs, the York School, and the Santa Catalina School for Girls will see their way clear to enter players in this event. Anyway, they may consider this an invitation to join the other schools of the Peninsula for the pleasure of the tournament.

Note: Nowak - Milwaukee, Wisc City Champion Wren - Jacksonville, Fla City Champion The 4th Annual Monterey International Open Chess Tournament was held at the Hotel San Carlos, Monterey, on June 8-9. Advance registration gave every indication that there would be well over 100 players entered in the tournament. However the total number of players was only 73. Three of the advance registrations withdrew and one San Francisco Expert, losing his game in the third round, also withdrew from the tournament, without explaination. The hotel management had plenty of tables and seats for all, set up in the large Pacific Room. There was little disturbing noise and one corner of the room was designated as the analysing area. George Koltanowski directed the tournament in his usual excellent style. There were no problems and the event was completed without argument or delay.

As California tournaments go, this was a rather weak one, with no masters entered. Apparently the cash prize fund will have to be raised to get the higher rated players to come to Monterey. This point will have to be considered by the tournament committee when preparing for the next Monterey Open.

Of the 73 players that participated in this tournament, 28 of them were able to take home a prize as the result of their play. Some of these won cash and a trophy for their efforts.

K. Grivainis, of Oakland took top honors and was named the Monterey International Open Champion. He won a cash prize of \$175 and took the big Monterey Cup with him when he left the tournament site.

E. Syrett, of Stanford and A. Suhobeck, of Monterey (Monterey County Champion), tied for second place and split the money for 2nd and 3rd.
