



Miley Staser Fall Scholastic (Nov. 19, 1983)

Grades 1,2, and 3 were combined in a double round robin. MICHAEL HALL won for 1st grade with ARNOLD KEKAUOHA in second place. The 2nd grade trophy was won by YVONNE KRAWIEC with a perfect score. She was followed by VIVIAN VALENTI in second place and OMAR MALIK in third. The 3rd grade trophy was taken by KAMIESHA TURNER ahead of DAKARAI SMITH and PATRICK CHEN.

Grades 4 and 5 were combined. There was a tie for 1st place between DANIEL KRAWIEC and MIKE OSMAN. Both scored 5-1 but Daniel took 1st on tie break.

Grade 6 saw another tie for 1st place between ERIK ANDERSON and MIKE BROADY at 8-1. ERIK took 1st on tie break. JASON NELSON was in third place.

Yet another tie in Grade 7. This time it was SHAWN CAMACHO and DEAN ROBERTS at $6\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$. They each defeated all the other opponents and drew the game with each other. The tournament director somehow managed to break the tie and award Shawn the 1st place on tie break. I would love to know how this was done. EMIL KEPKO captured third place. Grade 8 was separated into two divisions: In Division I SHOW KITAGAMI took 1st place with a perfect score. There was a tie for 2nd place between BRIAN LAU and STEVE RYKOWSKI.

In Division II RODRIGO SEAMAN was in 1st place with DAVID JOHNSTON in 2nd and STEVE ATKIN in 3rd.

Grade 9 had ROBERT CULLMANN in 1st place followed by SEAN McCLOSKEY (2nd) and DAVID ANDRE (3rd).

BERNARD MORRISON Spring Scholastic (Feb. 11)

This is the qualifying tournament for the Orange County Scholastic Championships.

Although there are three prizes for each section only the 1st and 2nd place winners qualify for the Peterson Invitational. Following is a list of the winners in order of placing (1st,2nd,3rd) with the first two named being the qualifiers. The only exceptions are in Grade 7 where the second place winner (Cliff Feldheim) was already qualified from the previous year. Because of a tie for third all three players are qualified for the Peterson tourney. And in Grade 9 there was a three way tie for 1st place hence all three players qualify.

At the end of the matches in Grade 5, between ERIC CABALO, RUSS GLIOTTONE, and JEFF OLSON, there was a tie between Eric and Jeff. In the playoff game ERIC CABALO was the winner.

Grade 6 had RICHARD LOPEZ winning against BEN COOK, MIKE BROADY, EMBER GROSS, and CHI NGO.

Grade 7 had another tie. DEAN ROBERTS and CLIFFORD FELDHEIM were tied ahead of ANDY OSMAN. CLIFFORD FELDHEIM won the playoff game to become champion.

In Grade 8 SHOW KITAGAMI defeated DANA LIEM, BRETT MALAS, BILL MATNEY, GREG SHERMAN, and HARRY WANG to take the title.

All-American Scholastic Championships (March 10-11, 1984)

This was a USCF rated tournament held at Labate's Chess Centre in Anaheim. There were 36 players in this 6 round swiss system event. It was divided into three sections (High School, Jr. High, and Elementary) with prizes for team and individual winners.

In the High School division SUNNY HILLS took the top team prize ahead of LYNWOOD. The individual winners were: BURT IZUMIKAWA (1st), ROGER POEHLMANN (2nd), TONY CHA (3rd), SEAN McCLOSKEY (4th), and KEVIN MOYNAHAN (5th). Burt Izumikawa had the only perfect

6-0 score. He defeated his main rival Roger Poehlmann in the 5th round giving Roger his only loss for the tournament. Both have USCF ratings of expert. The members of the Sunny Hills H.S. team were: Tony Cha, Kevin Moynahan, and Sean McCloskey. The Lynwood team had Kevin Holmes and Todd Andry. In the Junior High School Division the team prize was taken by McCOMBER INTER-MEDIATE players Show Kitagami, Greg Shinedling, Sean Paden, Steve Hodges (rd. 3), Chad Braithwaite (rds. 1,2, &3), and Scott Shinedling (rds. 4,5,&6). In Second place was BALBOA JR. HIGH (Clifford Feldheim, Bill Matney, Eric Sheeler, and Eric Hartman) followed closely by CALDER JR. HIGH (Chris Harvey, Harry Wang, Alex Rodriguez, and Dennis Palmero). SHOW KITAGAMI took 1st individual prize with CLIFFORD FELDHEIM (2nd), GREG SHINEDLING (3rd), HARRY WANG (4th), and SCOTT SHINEDLING (5th). The Elementary School Division had CALVARY CHAPEL SCHOOL (Daniel & Yvonne Krawiec) capturing 1st team prize. In the individual competition it was DANIEL KRAWIEC (1st). RICHARD LOPEZ (2nd), ANZAC JACOBS (3rd), JAMES WADE (4th), and YVONNE KRAWIEC (5th). Gold medals were also awarded to players in 7th-12th grades for individual performances. I WINNING CHESS TACTICS

By ROBERT M. SNYDER NATIONAL CHESS MASTER

In the first three diagrams White uses the discovered attack to win. A discovered attack is where one piece moves uncovering another piece of the same side. This uncovered piece attacks an enemy piece.

In the next three diagrams White uses the pin to win. When a piece is pinned it is prevented from moving because it is need to shield a more valuable piece from attack. The solutions follow the problems.




DIAGRAM 1 WHITE TO MOVE AND WIN A QUEEN




DIAGRAM 2 WHITE TO MOVE AND MATE IN 1 MOVE




DIAGRAM 3 WHITE TO MOVE AND MATE IN 1




DIAGRAM 4
WHITE TO MOVE AND WIN A QUEEN




DIAGRAM 5 WHITE TO MOVE AND WIN A QUEEN




DIAGRAM 6 WHITE TO MOVE AND WIN A QUEEN

SOLUTIONS

DIAGRAM #1 - White wins Black's Queen by playing 1 Nc6+ Be7 (if 1...Qe7 then 2 Nxe7) 2 Nxd8.

DIAGRAM #2 - White checkmates Black with 1 Nf6
which attacks the King with both the Knight and
the Queen at the same time.

DIAGRAM #3 - White checkmates Black with 1 Bb5 which attacks the King with both the Bishop and the Rook at the same time.

DIAGRAM #4 - White pins Black's Queen to the King with 1 Bb5.

DIAGRAM #5 - White uses both the pin and fork (double attack) to win Black's Queen with 1 Bb5 planning to meet 1...Qxb5 with 2 Nc7+ Kd8 3 Nxb5.

DIAGRAM #6 - White pins Black's Queen to the King with 1 Rel.
