Something new in Philidor's Defense. 3 ..., N-Q2, the Hanham Variation, was the accepted move until Nimzovitch introduced 3 ... N-KB3 into master play. This was considered stronger for some years. Later Nimzovitch returned to 3..., NoQ2. The text move is not good.

This can hardly be called a Caro-Kann Defense.

> P-QRL 3. N-KB3 P-R5 4. B-Q3 5. P-Q5

Could best utilize the time afforded by BlackIs useless moves by concentrating on a rapid development of his own pieces.

> 5. . . . PxP 6. PxBP 7. P-KR4 0 0 0

An impulsive move that he must have regretted the moment it was made.

7. . . . 8. B-B4 0 0 0 Not best. B-K3 is stronger. 8. . . . B-Q3

After seven pawn moves it is high time

to develop a piece!

9. P-K5 B-K2 10. 0-0 P-NL 11. PxP PxP 12. B-K3 0 0 0

At last he finds the right square. The inaccurate seventh and eighth moves nearly wrecks his position.

12. . . . P-N5?

Black's lack of development is too serious to indulge in the luxury of chasing the Knight to a better square.

13. N-R2 P-KBL 14. PxP e.p. NxP 15. NxP NxN 16. QxN P-KL

This just loses more rapidly than other moves. B-B3 would hold out a while longer.

17. B-N6ch K-Bl K-N2 18. Q-B3ch

If B-B3; 19. R-Q1, Q-K2; 20. B-QB5 wins. 19. Q-B7 mate.
