Pine, El Segundo, April 1-2-3. Sixty-eight participants included 17
masters and experts, and the struggle for the top spots was indeed one
to behold. Our congratulations to Bill MAILLARD and Robert JACOBS for
topping the field with 5 1/2-1/2 and sharing \$225 - as it often happens in
a Swiss, the two did not play each other; another round would have
established a clear winner.

Our congrats also go to others figuring in the prize-winning column,
such as R. KIRBY (third, \$40), John BLACKSTONE (Expert, \$50), Chuck
HENIN, Tim DELANEY and Art SPILLER (tie for fourth and E 2nd), Donald
COTTEN (A, \$40), G. THOMAS (B, \$30), R. COHAN (C, \$25) and a number of
others tying for second places in the class prizes. The upset prize of
\$15 went to Tim DELANEY of Rialto for defeating Tibor WEINBERGER in the
last round.

Bill MAILLARD, Bob JACOBS, Robion KIRBY, Charles HENIN and Art SPILLER
qualify into the 1966 Tournament of Champions. (Actually, BLACKSTONE
and DELANEY would rightfully be in there, but residing out of town
they cannot participate in the eight weekly rounds of the T. of Ch.)

dept. of Parks and Recreation for their wonderful organization of this
tournament, which was directed by your editor.

EL SEGUNDO POLKA DOTS

Bye-bye to byes.....Acting on the premise that chessplayers don't REALLY want to acquire a point awarded to them on a bye, but rather play (especially if they're from out of town), the El Segundo organizers adopted a "houseman" idea at their second Open. The houseman (who turned out to be a housewoman) played on a stand-by basis, filling in whenever there was an odd number of players, to avoid byes. While her score did not count in the overall scheme of things, her games counted for the opponents and are rated.....Superchess Contestant Charles JOYCE of Newport Beach introduced a novel fun-game, whereby any piece can move anywhere on the board, except the King (basic laws apply, otherwise you could never mate). Other rules: bishops must stay on their starting-color squares; pawns cannot move backwards, and may queen only from the seventh rank; and captures may be made only on "legal" moves. A far-fetched example: 1. QP-KN6, KBPxP; 2. KN-KN5, P-KR3; 3. Q-B7 mate. Finally an answer to the old Black two-move mate - 1. P-KB3, P-K4; 2. P-KN4, Q-R5 mate? Simply 3. N-N3 or B2!.....Last round plague Jerry HANKEN was once again deprived of bigger things by that last round loss - he had Q and 2 pawns v. three minor pieces in an exciting finish v. JACOBS, couldn't push it through.....A real trooper Robert COHAN, Class C winner, put forth his best effort to date in losing only one game (to John BLACKSTONE), drawing with an Expert and an A player, and defeating one B and two A opponents.....

Youngsters on the climb Theirs was the limelight in performing well - Jim TARJAN planted himself well among the experts, and A. GOJICH showed promise after a slow start in his first tournament ever.... Out-of-towners were well represented at the tourney, coming from San Diego, San Francisco, San Bdo, Riverside, Trona etc.....Rarity off-form It is indeed once in a blue moon that we see Senior Master Tibor WEINBERGER finish out of the top ten. His 23rd place finish was due to losses to Tim DELANEY and Enos WICHER, and a draw with Frank THORNALLY.. Many thanks to new TERRACHESS subscribers Donald COTTEN, Hank SHIPIN and Roland WEINHOLD.....Distinguished guests included Grand-master Isaac KASHDAN, who gave a nice writeup of the tournament in last Sunday's L.A. Times chess-column; Benton JAMES of the Atlas Chess Club,

taking orders for equipment and furthering his own cause by announcing his new rapid-transit schedule; and a delegation from North American Aviation's S & ID Division, picking up pointers for their newly-organized chess club.....Honored member All contestants gladly took a five-minute break to applaud Mrs. Betty COREY, one of the El Segundo Club's staunchest supporters (along with her husband, Bob COREY) in receiving a well-deserved trophy for her and her husband's outstanding efforts toward the betterment of the club.....

Quiz time There's no doubt that chessplayers are intelligent people, of course, but how much more so are they than normal people? Walt CUNNINGHAM was out to find out that and other things in a fifteen-minute written quiz, part of a survey he's taking in connection with his studies. The quiz was taken by all rated players just prior to start of the first round. We don't know the findings yet, but were pleasantly surprised at the cooperation Walt got from all those present. There was so much quietness around we began to wonder if they were really chessplayers..... See you next year?
