Walter BROWNE Laszlo BINET Ronald GROSS Jerome HANKEN

The four join the incumbent State Champion, Charles HENIN, and the qualifier from the California Open, young Jim TARJAN, to form an awesome six-some. Let's look at the six and their chances for the state's highest crown:

l.Charles HENIN - The current Champion, an experienced master who has been winning local honors for several years. A solid, calm player who adds excitement to most of hisgames by oft running short

of time. May very well repeat last year's feat.

2. Jim TARJAN - California Junior Champion last year, a top contestant for the U.S. title (Junior). Fast, has wolf-teeth and once has a slight advantage, never lets go. An impressive record, always ready to upset - can he be consistent enough to win the crown?

3. Walter BROWNE - on a visit from the east, has been collecting laurels in every event out here. Plays like a tiger, which earned him the U.S. Junior title last year. A definite contender for the state title.

4. Laszlo BINET - another visitor, from Venezuela, who has been harvesting crops from all and sundry. He'll be 'first division', for sure, may well go all the way.

5. Ronald GROSS - With numerous victories to his credit, and still

improving, he'll really show enterprise to be in the thick of it.

6. Jerome HANKEN - One of the best-known prolific and top players in the southland. Among many, his most impressive crown was probably that of the California Open a little while back. When in form, can equal the best of them...and he's in form right now - so watch out!
