## WAR THUTES OF THE COCKERS

A regular meeting of the Central California Chess Association was held on Friday, 5 April, 1968, in the Board and Committee Room of the Oakland Central YHCL, Oakland. The meeting was called to order at 8:10 p.m. by Martin Horrison, chairman pro tempore.

The following persons were present, representing their respective clubs, which were received into affiliation as charter members: Raymond Love (Alameda); Jerry Friedman, John Gerrand, Richard Hansen, Richard Lee, Elwin Meyers, Martin Morrison, Raymond Mg, William Parker (Oakland); Jerome Long, William Clipson, Dennis Reich, Paul Mesterline (Concord); Jerome Long (Berkele YMCA); Rudolph Quintero, A. Plastic, S. Damascens (Martinez); Peter Brown, Jr., Leonard Trottier, Jack Denn (Richmond); Duncan Campbell (Orinda); Saleh Mujched, Charles Vail (Malnut Creek); Paul Shannon (Bay Area Chess Muts Association); William Kennedy, by letter (Monterey). Observing were: K. Altuar, D. Hunting (Carlemont), Mr. York (San Mateo, Burlingame), Jerry Friedman (Markey).

The minutes of the previous neeting were approved as read.

It was moved by Er. Dennis and passed that all interested clubs not present be sent copies of the bylaws and minutes subsequent to this meeting.

A discussion of the principles on which the CCCA was

founded was held for the sake of the observers.

It was moved by ir. Nevers that it be the sense of the CCCA, firstly that the competition of two local chess organizations in this area is beneficial in providing more interest because of the increased activities and discussion of the proper course of chess organizations; secondly, that the CCCA feels it is more democratic in its nature and of more significance, since it is closely affiliated with and rated by USCF, a national organization; thirdly, that the CCCA deeply disapproves of many CFMC policies, but reaffirms that there is room for both organizations in Northern and Central California; fourthly, that the CCCA empects the competition of the two organizations to be of benefit to all local chess mlayers.

It was moved by in. Jesterline and passed that the

motion be tabled.

An election was held at this meeting and the following officers were elected for 1963: Jerone Long, Chairman; Saleh Mujahed, Secretary; Leonard Trottier, Treasurer; William Clipson, League Director; Donnis Reich, Rating Administrator; Martin Morrison and Elvin Meyers, Editors; Paul Shammon (West Bay) and Rich rd Lee (East Bay), Publicity Directors.

It was moved by Fr. Quintero that until the next meeting, the CCCA organ be mineographed binonthly, with a

short nonthly supplement.

A notion by Mr. Long was discussed, amended, and finally adopted: that the per capita assessment of clubs on the basis of their membership be 20 cents binouthly, the first installment to be mayable now to the Treasurer, 5315 MacDonald Ave., The Cerrito 94530 (233-1595) with a full list of members' names and addresses.

It was moved by hr. Dennis and massed that affiliates par 25 cents per capita for their assessment on the basis of the number of placers who play in those USCF-rated tournaments of the affiliate which draw a profit.

It was moved by Mr. Clipson and passed that the Chair appoint an ad hoc committee of three to come up with suggestions about league play. The Chair appointed Mr. Clipson, Chairman, Mr. Donnis, and Mr. Westerline.

Mr. Long reminded the numbers present to encourage

USCF learne play.

It was moved by Mr. Shannon and passed that an ad hor cornittee, consisting of the officers, handle administrative functions until the next meeting and report on anoments to the bylans.

It was moved by hr. Long and passed that the next regular meeting of the CCCA be held on Friday, 12 July, at 8:00 p.m., at the Cakland Chess Club, 225 lith St., Cakland.

It was moved by ir. Long and passed that the necting be adjourned. The Chair declared the necting adjourned at 11:30 p.n.
