

On Ngv. 2, 1973, a general membership meeting of the CCCA took place at the Ferheley YMCA. The meeting was called to order at 8:30 P.M. Present were William Atkins, Ed Delgado, Peter Prochaska, and Marc McNown from the Berkeley CC, Leonard Trottier (Richmond), Robert B. Manners (San Leandro), Hans Poschmann (Fremont), David Smith (Hayward), Tom Dorsch (UC Davis), and Saleh Mujahed (Walnut Creek). Business accomplished:

- 1. The resignation of Elwin Meyers from the posts of Chairman, CCCA and Editor, CHISS VOICE was read and accepted.
- 2. Ed Delgado was nominated for and elected to the post of Chairman, CCCA.
 3. Mr. Atkins offer to print uncoming issues of Chess Voice @ approximately
 350 an issue less than the present printer was secented.

4. Marc McNown was named editor of CHESS WOICE.

5. Hans Poschmann presented the Perpetual Trophy for the CCCA Knock-Out Championship to Mr. Dorsch, representing the Davis Club, which will have possession for a year.


