

# The New Chess Ladder

Winners now lose their accumulated points and start again at the bottom of the ladder. All solutions must be addressed to George Koltanowski, The Chronicle, San Francisco, and post-marked before midnight of Tuesday following publication of the problem. New solvers are always welcome and can enter the ladder-solving competition at any time.

One point will be given to all contestants who send in a solution—right or wrong; two points for each correct solution to a two-mover; one additional point for "cooks" (more than one correct key move); two points for a no-solution claim if justified (we do not print "no-solution" problems intentionally — but when such a problem does turn up, your claim of a "no solution" gets you two points); four points for each correct solution to a three-mover. Only key moves and main line of play for three-movers. Previous prize winners are indicated by a star (★).

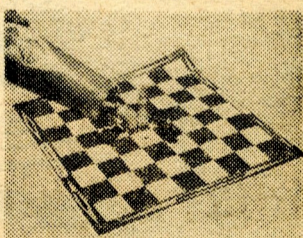
