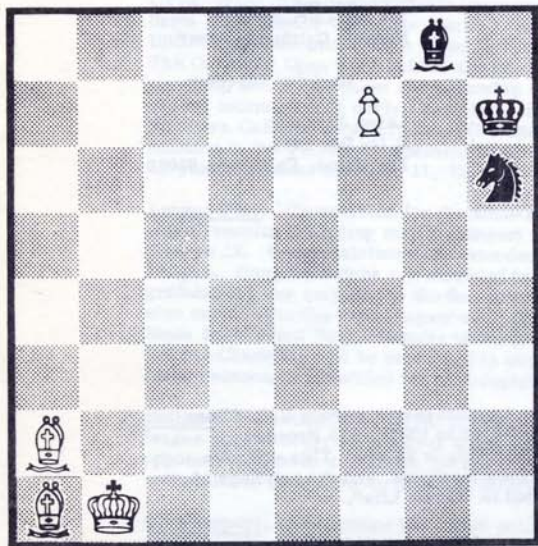
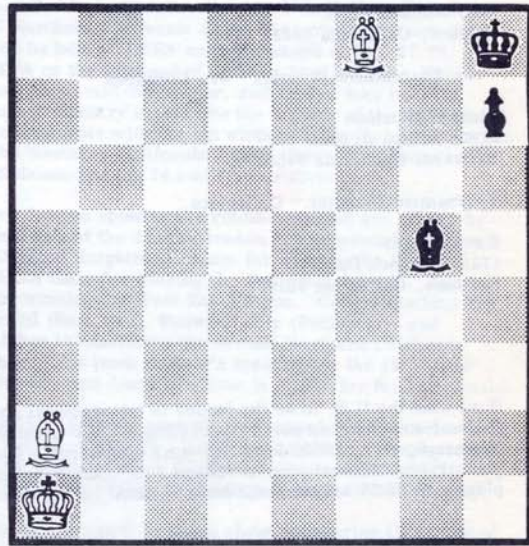

No. 9 White mates in one move



No. 10 White to take back his last move and mate in one move

As only nine players sent in solutions to our last problem set, we must assume that the problems were too complicated. Problem No. 5 was tricky and Problem No. 8 had a great many variations. Returning to the spirit of our first problem set, we present in this issue two mate-in-one problems, a unique mate-in-three problem, and a basic king plus pawn vs king endgame. In Problem No. 9, White mates in one move (no tricks). In Problem No. 10, White has just made a very bad move (this move is so bad that even a beginner wouldn't make it); White is to take back this move and replace it with a move that mates Black. In Problem No. 11, White has all his men on their original squares, and all of Black's men have been removed except for his king; White is to move and mate in three moves (there are two variations). In Problem No. 12, all of White's men except his king and king pawn have been removed, and all of Black's men except his king have been removed. White is to move and win. This ending is so close to a draw that Black could force the draw if it were his turn to move. You need only show one winning variation, but be sure to allow Black to make his best moves. Prizes will be awarded for the first set of correct solutions sent in by a B-player and by a C-player. Honorable mention will be made in Chess In Action for all members sending in correct solutions.

Upcoming Tournaments: The First Annual Chabot Open Chess Championship Tournament will be held at Chabot College on the weekend of August 9-10, 1969. This CFNC-rated event will be sponsored by the Chabot Chess Club and will feature cash prizes and trophies in each of the three following divisions: E-A, B, and C. Mike Goodall will act as tournament director. See page 17 for further details.

The Oakland Chess Club will hold their Sixth (!) Annual Oakland Summer Chess Championship Chess Tournament at the CACA Lodge, 303 Eighth Street, Oakland on the weekend of August 23-24, 1969. Trophies and book prizes will be awarded in each of the three following divisions: E-A, B, and C. Raymond Ng will direct this CFNC-rated event. See page 17 for further details.

CFNC-rated chess championship tournaments scheduled for next fall will include the following: The Santa Clara Junior Open, the fourth-annual CFNC Northern California Class Championships, and the USCF Sunnyvale Open; these three tournaments will be held at LERA on the weekend of Sept 27-28, 1969. The Carlmont Open to be held at the Carlmont YMCA on the weekend of October 20-21, 1969. Novato may hold their 1969 chess championship tournament about mid-November, and Chabot may hold its second tournament in early December. December and January should see the running of the third annual Northern California Junior Chess Championship tournaments with the top winners from the various areas meeting in the Playoff Tournament to determine the Northern California Junior Chess Champions in the 10-year and under division; 11, 12, and 13 year division; and the 14 and 15 year division.

League Play. Crosstables for the 1968-1969 CFNC League showing the round-by-round and player-by-player results (including rating changes) for the last half of the League season are presented on pages 9 through 12. Congratulations are extended to the Oakland Knighthawks team for winning the East Bay League. Congratulations are extended to the LERA-A team for winning the Peninsula League. Congratulations are extended to the San Bruno team for winning the West Bay League. Congratulations are also extended to the three runner-up teams: Hayward (East Bay), Redwood City (Peninsula), and Santa Rosa (West Bay). Results of the playoff matches to determine the overall Northern California League Champion will be presented in our next issue. The team captain's meeting for the 1969-1970 league season is scheduled for mid-September. See the next issue of Chess In Action for further details.

Ratings: We continue the CFNC policy of using the IRS (instantaneous rating system) for tournament and league play whereby each player knows his rating before each game, knows his handicap rating once his opponent is known, and knows his new rating as soon as his game is finished. The June 1969 CFNC rating list is presented on pages 13 through 16. The rating change calculation is explained on page 16.

Club Support: We continue the CFNC policy of providing support to chess clubs sponsoring CFNC-rated chess events; this includes providing score sheets, wall charts, pairing cards, etc. It also includes placing tournament announcements and tournament results in Chess In Action.

Board Action. At the last Board meeting, the CFNC Board of Directors elected Mr. Steve Berger to the position of Tournament Director - Collegiate. Steve will promote chess at the college and junior college level, and will act as coordinator between CFNC and these collegiate organizations.

We still need additional board members. Anyone interested in participating on the Board of Directors should make his interest known to Jim Hurt, P. O. Box 451, Sunnyvale.

Club News: The Chabot chess club is to be commended for promoting chess by holding their first open chess tournament on August 9/10, 1969. The Hayward chess club has just held another of their very successful summer chess festivals, and are to be commended for their very fine efforts to promote chess. The Daly City chess club will be holding their second annual chess picnic soon; contact Lou Korens (756-1345) for further details.

FIRST ANNUAL SUNNYVALE JUNIOR OPEN CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT

The First Annual Sunnyvale Junior Open Chess Championship Tournament was held at LERA, Sunnyvale, on the weekend of April 26-27, 1969. Richard Shorman of Hayward acted as Tournament Director; he was ably assisted by Dr. Joseph Wissel of Mountain View. A total of 41 juniors participated in three age-group divisions. A first-place trophy and a second-place trophy were awarded in each division, and all players received certificates signed by International Chessmaster George Koltanowski. Genial George also gave the juniors a short talk just before the tourney started. Matthew Sullivan of San Jose promptly took the talk to heart and won the first-place trophy in the 10-year and under division with a perfect score of five straight wins; Victor Yalom of Palo Alto broke into the winner's circle for the first time by winning the second-place trophy; James Oberritter, Shawn Hurt, Daniel Stromer, Carolyn Withgitt, and Ted Fong all tied for third place. In the 11, 12, and 13 year division, Jeffrey White of Arroyo Grande finally captured a first-place trophy, the second-place trophy going to Brant Corenson of Los Gatos; Joey Fameli of Novato placed third, Reid Yalom of Palo Alto placed fourth, and Todd Corenson of Los Gatos; placed fifth. In the 14 and 15 year division, Carl Mueller of Los Altos won the first-place trophy, Dave Thompson of Sunnyvale won the second-place trophy, Richard Gordon of San Jose placed third, Neil Spingarn of Sunnyvale placed fourth, and Dennis Myers of San Jose placed fifth. Explanation of Rating Change Calculation: Each player has an exact rating before each game, during each game, and after each game. The player's rating before a given game (referred to as his start rating) is his rating after his last game. The player's rating during his current game (referred to as his handicap rating) is equal to his start rating plus 4 percent of the difference between his opponent's start rating and his start rating if his opponent has the higher rating, or is equal to his start rating minus 4 percent of the difference between his start rating and his opponent's start rating, if he has a higher rating than his opponent. The player's rating after a given game is equal to this handicap rating plus 16 points if he won his game, is equal to his handicap rating if his game was drawn, and is equal to his handicap rating minus 16 points if he lost his game. Four percent tables will be found at the bottom of your score sheet.

Explanation of Crosstable Symbols: The following definitions of the symbols used in our crosstables will help you to understand our crosstables:

- W28 - You won from player number 28.
- L28 - You lost to player number 28.
- D28 - You drew with player number 28.
- BYE - You were not paired in this round; you score one point, but there is no rating change.
- DEF - You defaulted by not appearing for your scheduled game within one hour of the starting time; you score a zero for a loss, but there is no rating change.
- FOR - The tournament director gives you a forfeit (unsportsmanlike conduct, etc); you score a zero for a loss, but there is no rating change.
- WBF - You won by a forfeit as the tournament director gave your opponent a forfeit, you score one point for a win, but there is no rating change.

Strong players sometimes lose to weaker players because weaker players sometimes play strong games.

In the opening, you should play like a book; in the middle game, you should play like a magician; and in the end game, you should play like a machine.

1969 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP CHESS MATCH

The 1969 World Championship Chess Match was held in Moscow between Tigran Petrosian (champion) and Boris Spassky (challenger) from April 14 to June 25 (approximately). After a tough fight, Spassky won by the score of 12.5 to 10.5 (the 24th game was not played). The 19th game was considered to be the prettiest of all those played in the match. Spassky seized the initiative in the opening, attacked energetically, fearlessly sacrificed pawns and pieces, and won brilliantly. We present this game for your amazement and enjoyment. The notes are by Efrim Geller.

(a) Reverting back to his favorite variation of the Sicilian Defense. Until now Spassky had been unable to profit fully from his pre-match research into Petrosian's opening systems, because the champion had avoided all his usual defenses as Black.

(b) Masters have played this move hundreds of times before and never met the surprising reply in this game.

(c) Almost automatically, everyone else had always retreated the Bishop to KR4. Black's position has suddenly become critical.

(d) At this stage of the game perhaps Petrosian did not yet sense the extreme urgency of the situation. Extraordinary measures are called for, e.g., 9... P-K4!? 10 N-B5 BxN 11 PxR B-B1 12 B-N3 B-K2, and if 13 K-N1, then after 13... RxN! 14 QxR QxQ 15 PxQ N-K5 at least Black has counterplay.

(e) Both sides have completed their preparations for the middlegame: White, for successful attack; Black, for maximum defense.

(f) A bold and, more importantly, correct sacrifice of a Pawn.

(g) Black must accept the Pawn as the lesser of two evils, since the threat of P-KN5 is too dangerous to ignore.

(h) Notwithstanding their apparent simplicity, White's last two moves are very strong.

(i) After 18... P-K4 19 N/4-K2 (or 19 N-B3) Black cannot very well parry 20 Q-N6.

(j) Or 19... P-K4 20 N-K6! PxN 21 PxP BxP 22 RxN, and resignation is in order.

(k) No better is 20... BxP 21 NxB PxN 22 P-K5 PxP 23 N-K4!

(l) The most forceful move. Black can still resist after 23 N-KB3 N-B5 24 Q-N4 Q-B2.

(m) The more accurate 23... N-B5 also loses to 24 RxN PxR 25 N-KB3 Q-N3 26 R-N5!! (26 R-N2 Q-N4) B-B3 27 N-B6 B-K5 28 QxRPch.

(n) Black resigns in the face of 24... PxN 25 QxNch K-N1 26 Q-B7ch K-R1 27 R-B3, and there is no defense against mate. (27... P-K4, 28 Q-R5 mate).

Variation B: after 1. K-N2 P-R4, 2. K-R3 P-B4, 3. K-N3 P-N3, 4. K-N2 P-R5, 5. K-R3 P-N4, 6. K-R2 and White wins (see Variation A1, 6. K-R2). Variation B1: after 4... P-N4 5. K-N3 P-R5ch, 6. K-R3 P-B5, 7. K-N4 and White wins; or if 5... P-N5, 6. K-N2 P-R5, 7. K-R2 and White wins (see Variation A2, 7. K-R2).

We missed 5-year-old Kevin Meier at the recent Sunnyvale Open Junior Chess Championship tournament. We hope he will come to the next Junior tournament scheduled this fall for the weekend of September 27-28 at LERA.

Chess is being taught in one of our local schools as part of its curriculum. Cherry Chase school in Sunnyvale has taught approximately 80 Junior High math students to play chess, and chess sets are available in the school library. Each time that a player makes a chess move, he must solve a complex problem involving many variables. This type of training should prove useful in solving math problems. In turn, we can look forward in a few years to the appearance of new chess talent in the Sunnyvale area. Lets hope that many other schools utilize chess to promote the development of problem solving abilities among their students.

Now that Spassky has defeated Petrosian for the world chess championship, those people who have never thought that Petrosian was a truly great player will have added evidence to support their views. However, looking at the match from the opposite point of view, what other living player could have scored 10-1/2 points against Spassky in a 24-game match!

The recent Stamer Memorial chess tourney at Mechanics Institute in San Francisco was so strong that Dave Betanco's USCF rating of 1737 points only placed him 46th in a field of 83 players, 30 of which had ratings above 1900 points. Dave ended up playing six players who had ratings higher than his and only one player who had a rating below his. Tough tournament!

Women in Chess: Janice Lieberman of Santa Clara won a first-place trophy at the recent Monterey Open Chess tourney, and Mrs. Ronn Williams of Boulder Creek won a first-place trophy at the recent San Bruno Chess Festival.

Local International Chessmaster George Koltanowski has been invited to act as tournament director for the big international chess tournament at Palma de Mallorca, Spain this coming November. The new world chess champion Boris Spassky and many other chess greats will be playing under George's watchful eyes. Looks like George has finally hit the big time!

A certain chess player from the Oakland Chess Club has been experimenting with a rather unusual Black opening. His game at the recent Stamer Memorial with Dave Betanco started out as follows: 1. P-K4 P-KB4, 2. PxP K-B2, 3. Q-R5ch P-N3, 4. PxPch K-N2. We will not divulge the name of this USCF-rated A-player, as he may want to surprise you with this gambit in an upcoming tournament. He will certainly get you "out of the books" with this opening.

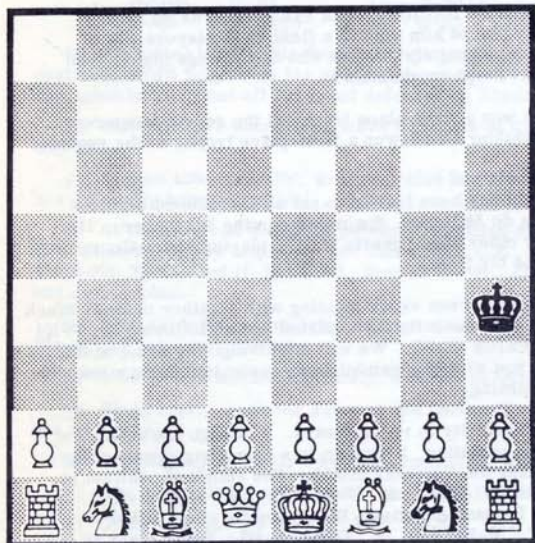
The Dragon variation of the Sicilian has gained in popularity in recent years. Although not nearly as popular as the Najdorf variation or the Scheveningen variation, it results in a very sharp game with chances for both sides, especially when White utilizes the Yugoslav attack. The standard position is reached after the moves 1. P-K4 P-QB4, 2. N-KB3 P-Q3, 3. P-Q4 PxP, 4. NxP N-KB3, 5. N-QB3 P-KN3 (P-KN3 establishes this as the Dragon variation; Black usually plays either 5....P-QR3 or 5....P-K3) 6. B-K3 B-N2, 7. P-B3 0-0, 8. Q-Q2 N-B3. White plans to castle long and then to conduct the Yugoslav attack which involves a mate threat as shown by the following White moves: B-QB4, P-KR4, P-R5, B-R6, RPxNP, BxB, Q-R6ch, and Q-R8 mate. Black plans to conduct an attack against the White king, usually with the following Black moves: B-Q2, Q-R4, R-QB1, N-K4, RxN, R-QB1, and N-QB5. White's attack is based on obtaining an open KR file; Black's attack is based on sacrificing the exchange (RxN) to break up the pawns protecting the White king. With both players conducting an all-out attack against the opposing king, it is often just a matter of who gets there first! The main line continues as follows: 9. B-QB4 B-Q2, 10. P-KR4 Q-R4, 11. P-R5 NxRP, 12. 0-0-0 KR-B1, 13. B-N3 N-K4, 14. B-R6 BxB, 15. QxB RxN, 16. PxR R-QB1, 17. N-K2 N-KB3, 18. K-N1 B-N4, 19. N-B4 B-B5 = (if 14 P-N4 N-KB3, 15. B-R6 RxN, 16. PxR BxB, 17. RxB R-QB1 =). If you like a lively game with plenty of counterchances, next time try the Dragon Sicilian.

All the mistakes are there, waiting to be made.

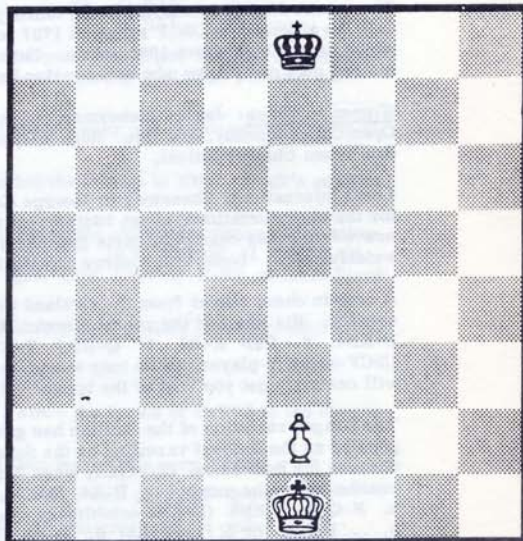

Solution to problems presented in last issue. Problem No. 5 - White has made an illegal move (P(K3) - K4) placing his king in check; the penalty is only that he must take back the illegal move and make a legal move. White returns the pawn to K3 and plays B-N2 mate. Problem No. 6 - White plays 1. Q-Q6 and although White has no threats, Black is in Zugzwang and any move he makes allows White to mate in one move (1.... PxQ, 2 R-B1 mate; 1.... R-any, 2. QxQP mate; 1.... P-N4, 2. Q-R6 mate; and 1.... P-B3/B4, 2. Q-N8 mate). Problem No. 7 - another Zugzwang problem. White plays 1. Q-R8 and although White has no mate threats, any move Black makes allows White to mate in one move (1.... P-B5, 2. Q-R1 mate; 1.... P-B6, 2. KxP mate; and 1.... P-N7, 2. K-N4 mate). Problem No. 8 - Neither the Black king nor the White pawns can move without losing immediately (1.... K-B2, 2. P-R7). So the battle is between the White king and the three Black pawns. White wins as follows: After 1. K-N2 P-R4, 2. K-R3, Black must choose between 2.... P-N4 (Variation A) and 2.... P-B4 (Variation B). (1. K-N2 P-N4, 2. K-N3 P-R4, 3. K-R3 leads in to Variation A on the 4th move.) Variation A: after 1. K-N2 P-R4, 2. K-R3 P-N4, 3. K-N3 P-B4 (3.... P-B3,
