World Record Holder for Simultaneous Exhibition Play  
On Nationwide Tour

ALL CHESS PLAYERS FROM BEGINNER TO MASTER ARE INVITED TO PLAY.

At age 17, Mr. Acers was a rated chess master, the youngest ever in the southern United States, and was Chess Champion of Louisiana State. At 22, he captured the world record for a simultaneous exhibition by playing 114 games, winning them all in 8½ hours. At 26, he drew a match with International Grandmaster Walter S. Browne, of Australia. Now at 27, the Master has over 20,000 exhibition game and 150 tournament wins to his credit.

In addition, he is one of the most exciting chess lecturers in the world. He has spellbound audiences across the country, one reporter describing his rush of words as "a machine gun with its trigger stuck."

His activities have been covered by Sports Illustrated, The New York Times, and numerous radio and television stations.
