LONE PINE CHESS TOURNAMENT GHANDMASTER GUARANTIES

All grandmasters who play and finish the Lone Pine Tournament will receive a minimum guarantee of \$600 if they do not win that much.

Higher guaranties will go to some grandmasters, based on their ratings on the 1981 FIDE list. Those rated 2550 to 2595 will receive \$800, and those with ratings 2600 and over will receive \$1,000. A grandmaster will receive either the amount noted or his prize, whichever is greater.

LONE PINE CHESS TOURNAMENT FOR PLAYERS GOING FROM LOS ANGELES

We are chartering a bus from Los Angeles to Lone Pine, about 200 miles away. There is no charge to the players. This will leave about 2 P. M. Saturday, March 28, from the Travelodge International Hotel, 9750 Airport Blvd.

If you are coming by plane to Los Angeles, please let me know the airline, flight number and time of arrival. We will try to meet you at the airport. If you arrive that Saturday, and no one meets you, call the Travelodge at 645-4600. They will send a car for you. Or take a taxi for the short distance.

The only public transportation from Los Angeles to Lone Pine is by the Greyhound Bus Line, which is about a six hour trip. The alternatives are to go by private car, or to rent a car at the airport.
