in order to safeguard the KP. With 7. ...,
P-QN4; 8. B-N3, P-N5,
Black wins a pawn, however after 9. N-R4,
(or 9. N-N1, NxP; 10. Q-B3) NxP;
10. R-K1! White has a powerful attack.

With the Black King not located in the same place, White gets distinctive ideas and no longer gives up the KP.

10 . B-N2 ?

Neglecting the matter at hand. Correct is 10, QN_Q2.

11 . P-K5

Opening the KB file will only help White . Better moves are N-Q4, KN-Q2, and N-K1.

12 . PxP

KN-Q2

or 12...., N-Q4; 13. RxP! NxB; 14. Q-R4 and white takes the upper hand.

13 . RxP!!

RxR

White strikes oil!

If 13, NxP (13...., KxR; 14. Q-R5ch wins) NxKP (or 14. RxPch) Q moves 15. RxPch, K-R1; RxPch , K-N1; 16 . 17. R-N7ch, K-R1; 18. Q-R5 Checkmate.

14. NxKP 15. Q-R5

Q-QB1 N-KB3

If 15, P-R3; 16. Q-N6 wins, and if 15, P-N3; 16. BxKNP, PxB; 17. QxP ch wins.

16 . PxN

QxN

Concedes mate in two. Counteraction is left with 16 ..., PxP, and Analysis and Anal but white pursues with 17. B-KB5.

QxP ch K_B1 18. Q-R8 Mate.
